

Speyside "Out" as Central School Location

No Decision on Site Until Georgetown Joins District, Says Department - Esquering Share Too High; Reeve Curfe.

The Department of Education will sanction no decision on the location of a central high school for North Halton until after Georgetown has officially joined the district in January...

Arthur Beaumont of Glen Williams, who is chairman of the North Halton High School District board opened the meeting and asked for the election of a chairman for the meeting...

He first called on Mr. Duffin to explain the department's attitude. Mr. Duffin said that the location of a school is a matter to be decided by the area board...

The meeting was then declared open for a question period and some of the questions and answers were as follows:

Q.—What time basis do we plan for? A.—A five year plan. If buildings are poor, start one building as soon as possible...

Q.—Does the department specify Speyside as a location? A.—No, Speyside is not mentioned in the by-law...

Q.—(Dr. Martin) — The board has picked a site, but we are led to believe by the department that the Speyside situation must be eliminated first...

A.—I don't think the department would approve any site picked by the board as it is now constituted. It would look as if it was being pushed for some reason.

Mr. Coon, one of the Aclon members of the board, took exception to this statement, and said that the board had had the matter under discussion for three years and was doing its best to make a decision.

W. R. Stewart, former high school inspector for this district who was instrumental in the forming of the board, was present at the meeting and said he believed that the Minister of Education would like some assurance that Speyside was "out" as a location and suggested that a vote be taken...

Thus far, there have not been any cases in this county and only one in surrounding counties. This one case occurred last week in Brampton. It illustrates that no family is completely safe since the case was the 6 year old daughter of the County Health Officer in Peel County.
