## Former Halton Warden, E. M. Readhead Dies

A prominent county resident and former Warden of Halton, Ernest M. Readhead died suddenly at his home at Louville, Nelson Township on Sunday, July 3rd. He was born on the home farm, lot 7, concession 4, on February 17th, 1883, the son of the late John and Mary Readhead. He attended Louville and Mt. Nemo schools and was an active member of Louville Methodist Church, later Lowville United. He married Margaret Gault who predeceased him in November, 1941.

Actively interested in municipal affairs, he served on the Nelson Council as a councillor from 1923 to 1929, deputy-reeve in 1929-30 and was reeve from 1931 to 1933, as well as being chosen for the county's highest office of Warden in a 1932. He served for 8 years as a school trustee. A successful farmer, he had a keen interest in agricultural affairs. During his 32-year connection with Halton Agricultural Society, he had been director, president and finally secretary-treasurer, which office he held at the time of his death. For the past two years he had been county weed inspector and also chairman of the Halton Tree Conservation Committee.

Mr. Readhead was one of the oldest members of Campbell Lodge, AF & AM No. 803. He was Master of this lodge in 1937 and was nominated district secretary of Hamilton District A in 1938. A life member of Campbell Lodge, V. Wor. Bro. Readhead was elected Grand Steward of the Grand-Lodge of Canada in 1939.

In 1943 he married the former Ellen Hartley who survives him. He also leaves one daughter, Mrs. Sarah Eleanor Coulson, one son, George Ernest Readhead, and four grandchildren, George, Margaret, Eleanor and Marilyn Coulson. A Masonic funeral service was conducted from his late residence on July 5th with interment following in Lowville United Church cemetery. Rev. A. D. Penman and Rev. E. G. Riddolls, Brantford, officiated, with his nephew Ross Readhead, and W. M. Stan Robinson assisting. The Lowville Male Quartet, Messrs. Readhead, Coulson, McArthur and Coulson sang one of his favourite hymns during the service. Many beautiful floral tributes bespoke of his genial personality, ever willingness to serve his community and the high esteem he enjoyed among his many friends. In his death Halton County has lost a valued citizen.

The pallbearers were Rt. W. Bro. Frank McIven, Wor. Bro. Edgar Ellenton, Wor. Bro. Elmer Foster, Wor. Bro. E. D. Mahon, Bro. Lloyd Crawford and Bro. W. J. Robertson.

## TURKEY VULTURE SEEN NEAR THE GLEN

J. R. Williams, rural mail courier, spotted a rare bird in this district when he saw a turkey vulture recently. The bird was only about five yards away as he drove by and he had a good look at it. The vulture is dark brown with a wing spread of about four feet, and a bald head of similar appearance to a domestic turkey. The vultures circle at great heights in the air and feed on dead prey only, rather than making their own kills.

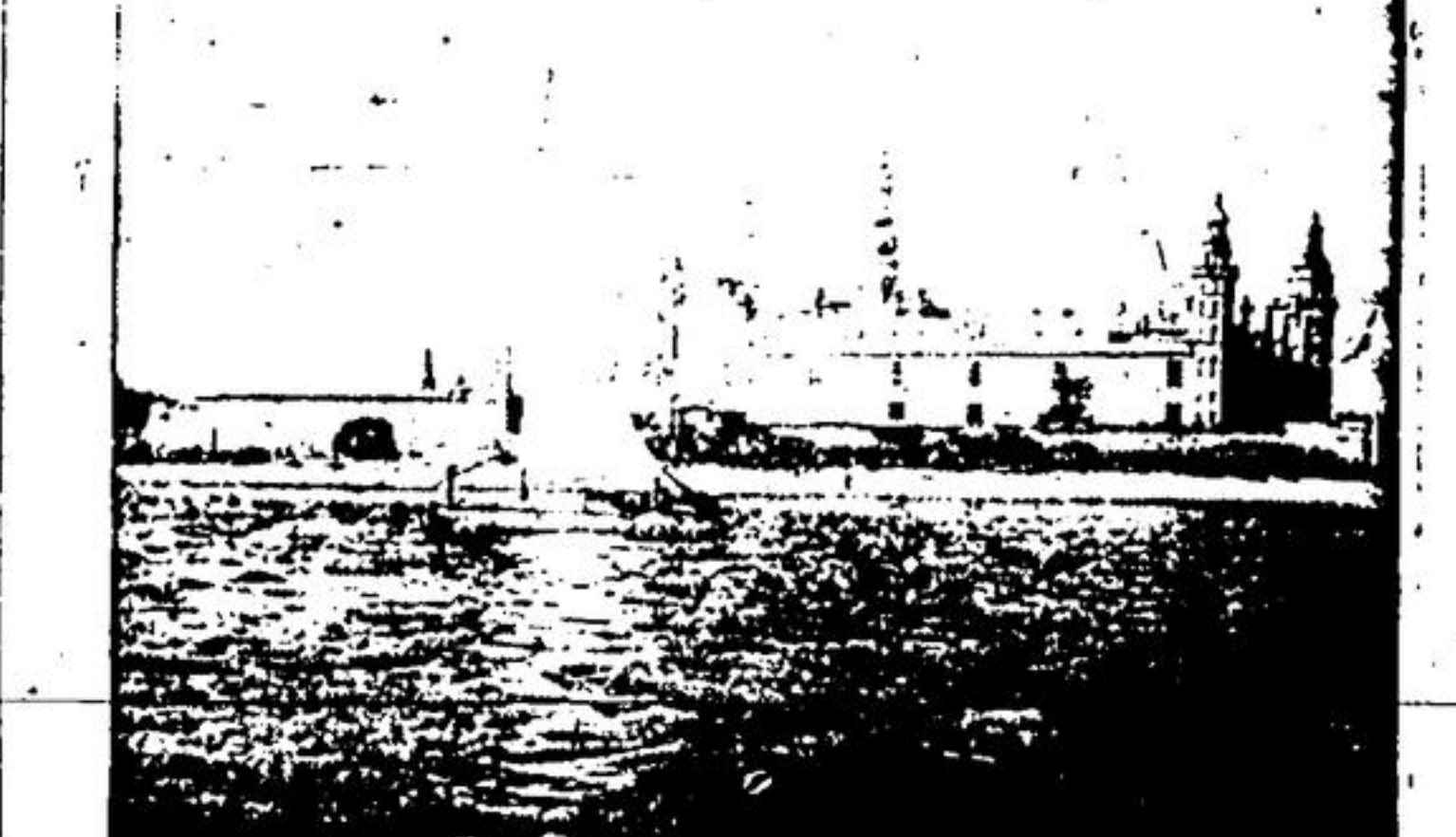
