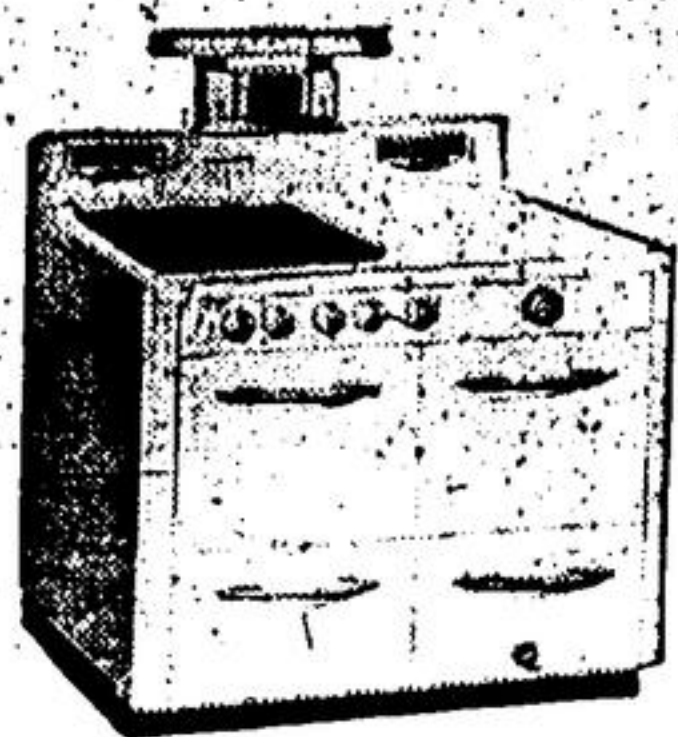

LORNE SCOTS TRAIN AT PETAWAWA CAMP

Numbered among a group of officers and men of the Lorne Scots who are taking their annual summer training at Petawawa Military Camp this week is Captain Paul Barber of Georgetown. The week's training program is mostly practical, with lectures cut to a minimum and included a full program of range firing and handling of weapons. The highlight is a fire-power demonstration showing the striking power of an infantry company supported by a squadron of tanks and the support artillery and mortars normally provided such a force.
