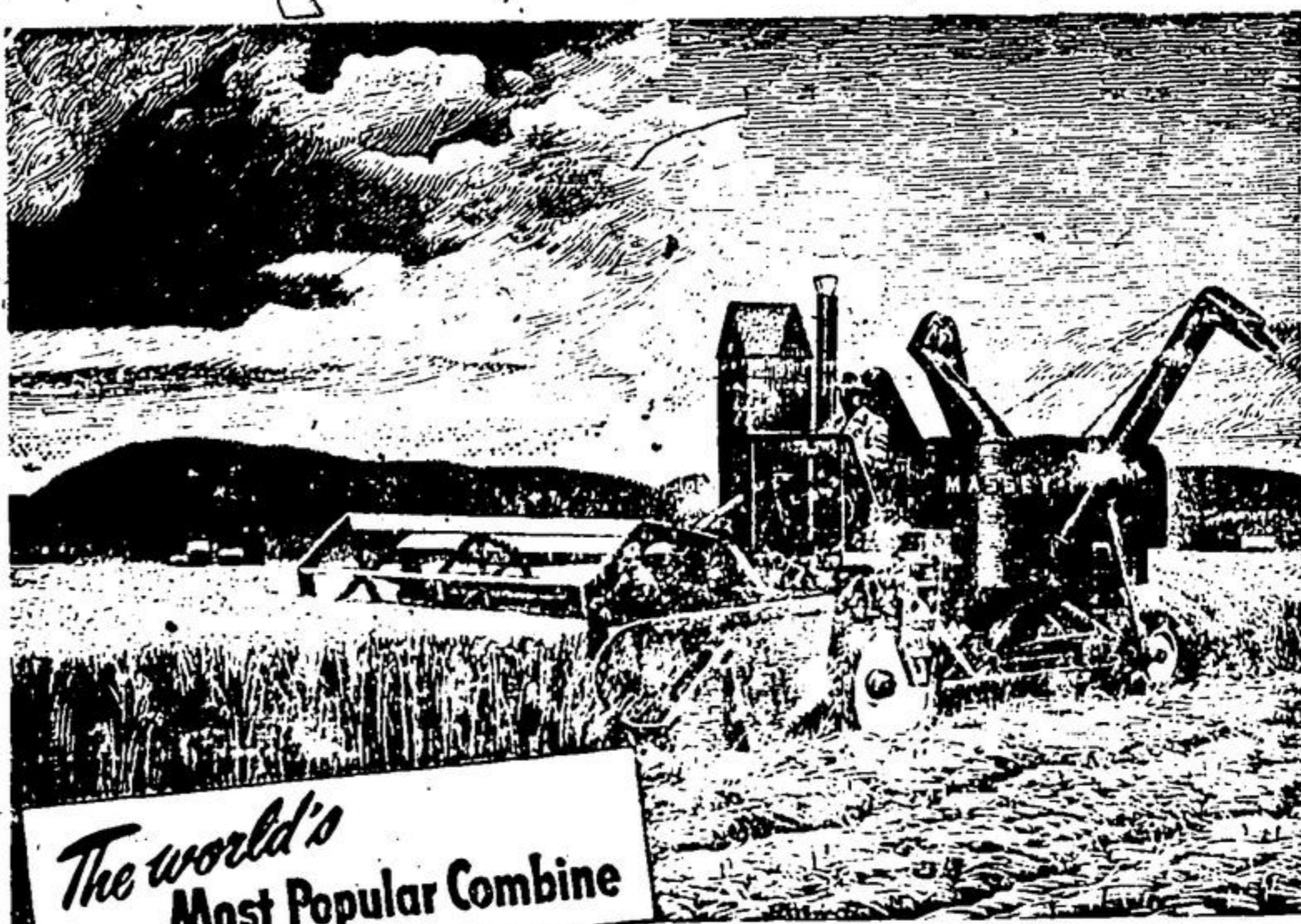
**GRC PROMOTES
