**New School Planned For Glen Williams**

With the old school building in Glen Williams unfit for occupancy, school will meet temporarily this year in two locations, St. Alban's Parish Hall and the United Church Sunday School room. The move has been caused by the collapse of part of the old building early this summer when an excavation was being made in preparation for adding a new room to relieve overcrowding at the school.

The board of Esplanade School Area No. 1, which administers the school business, has decided to build a complete new three-room school rather than attempt to repair the old building. Architect's sketches of the building which will be along modern lines are at present being completed and calls for tenders for the construction will soon be asked. A site for the new building has been selected and a property beside the Arthur Beaumont residence has been purchased from Miss Olive Logan.

Until the new school is built, only two classrooms will be in operation, with Mrs. Edna Beaumont and Mrs. Nellie Gardiner sharing the teaching. A third teacher will be added to the staff after the new school is completed.
