POLIOMYELITIS

Two cases of poliomyelitis have been reported to Halton County Health Unit during the fourth week of August. These are a 19-month-old baby girl and a 12-year-old girl. Both live in Oakville. The latter child became ill while out of town on holidays and was first the infectious stage before diagnosis was made. Both children were admitted to hospital.

On August 29th, a further case of a boy aged 11 months in Esqueving Township, near Georgetown was reported. This child has been admitted to hospital with some slight paralysis.

A total of 15 cases have been reported in Halton this year.
