Comments on the Lesson

Sunday, October 2nd

THE CALL OF ISALAH
 The series of lessons planned for this remaining quarter of 1949 is entitled "The Prophets Speak" and is concerned with the study of two particular prophets, Isaiah and Jeremiah. The first lesson, "The Call of Isalah" tells of his being set apart for a great task under God and the key verse is, of course, The familiar Is. 6:8. "I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, Here am I; send me." Here we have the "never-to-be-forgotten experience of" a man who saw himself and his people as sinful before God — a man who felt the cleansing power of the divine and who accepted the great commission to go forth as God's ambassador to a needy nation.

The Biblical Basis:
 Isalah 1:1-10:
 In these verses we read of the passing of an earthly king and the prophet's realization of the Heavenly King of Kings. "I saw also the Lord, sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up." "Holy, Holy, Holy, is the Lord of Hosts: the whole earth is full of his glory." Becoming conscious of the holiness of God the prophet also becomes aware of his own uncleanness standing out in direct contrast. He sees also the sinful nature and condition of his fellowmen and realizes their pitiful plight before God. Such a vision creates within him the attitude of deep repentance and causes him, to be the grateful recipient of Divine forgiveness. Thus purged of his sense of guilt, the burden of the unrepentant and the unforgiven lies heavily upon his heart and he accepts the challenge to go forth as a servant of God. He goes out from his high level of personal religious experience to share his conviction in an effort to bring his fellow-men to the place where they too can cry: "Mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts" and come under his redemptive and purifying power. He goes out, however, in the realization that his message will cut deep into the lives of men and will not be popularly received.

The Application:
 From a study of this lesson we receive knowledge concerning Isalah's call. Such knowledge is only beneficial to us, inasmuch as we can apply it to our lives in this day and age. As we read the text of our lesson over and over again the beauty, grandeur and significance of its truth ought to become so real to us that we too can cry out: "Mine eyes have seen the King, the Lord of Hosts." It ought to drive us to the point of self-examination before God, and through self-examination to the place of penitence and humble confession, where, like the prophet of old, we can experience the joy of cleansing and forgiveness. Such an experience will give us the challenge of Christian service and our souls must surely answer: "Here am I; send me." Convention Movies Shown at Lions Club Meeting

Another idea being considered by the committee is a contest next spring for home improvements. After the meeting several members and their wives enjoyed an hour's bowling at the Lucky Strike Club. If enough members are interested, this will become a regular after-meeting event.
