**"THRIFTCOAT ENAMEL" NEW PROVINCIAL PAPER PRODUCT**

Constantly increasing demand for the machine-coated paper it introduced to Canada two years ago has outrun the capacity of the Port Arthur Mill and has decided Provincial Paper Limited to install a second such unit there at a cost of \$375,000. D. W. Ambridge, president of the company, announced in Toronto this week.

Installation of the second unit is to begin as quickly as possible, Mr. Ambridge said, with the expectation that the resulting increase in production will become available by the middle of the coming year. Provincial sells this machine-coated grade exclusively in Canada under the trade-name "Thriftcoat enamel."

It won immediate popularity among the publishing, printing, and advertising industries upon its first introduction in 1947. Most Canadian periodicals, for instance, now use it.
