SEPTEMBER RECORDS GOOD FOR JERSEYS

During the month of September there was the usual large number of Jersey records reported to the Record of Performance from Halton, Peel and York Counties.

Heading the list this month was the grand old matriarch Brampton Lady Basilua 88733, who at thirteen years of age, produced 13,167 lbs. of milk, 807 lbs. of fat, on three times milking for 349 days. On two times milking, Lacadana Velvet Star, 148343, completed a record at five years of age of 11,547 lbs. of milk, 558 lbs. of fat, in 365 days. She is owned and tested by Allan O. Crossley, King. A Gold Medal Certificate was issued to Lindale Estella Lucille, 120808, for her 305 day record of 9,971 lbs. of milk, 678 lbs. of fat, with a test of 6.80 per cent. Owner is Maurice C. Beaty, at Milton.

In the four year old class, in 365 days, Brampton Gipsy Bas B., 152659, produced 15,865 lbs. of milk, 761 lbs. of fat, on three times milking, qualifying for Silver and Gold Medal Certificates. She is bred and owned by B. H. Bull and Son, Brampton. On two times milking, Bubble's Standard Dot, 154031, led the parade with a production of 12,029 lbs. of milk, 613 lbs. of fat, with a test of 5.10 per cent for Cline Burr & Sons, Gormley. In 305 days, on three times milking, Brampton Facts Basil — 150943, produced 8,380 lbs. of milk, 489 lbs. of fat, with a test of 5.84 per cent. Facts Basil is owned by B. H. Bull and Son. Mrs. Alice Hawkes Robinson, Newmarket, was represented by Inniscarra Excellent Oriole, 181465, with a record of 7,155 lbs. of milk, 344 lbs. of fat in 305 days, on two times milking.

Royal Cecilia 3rd, 189156, as a Junior three-year-old completed a record of 7,301 lbs. of milk, 471 lbs. of fat, in 365 days, for E. Mac-Gilp, of Woodbridge. Maurice L. Beaty was issued a Silver Medal Certificate for the production of Lindale Basil D. Flash, 169361, 9,009 lbs. of milk, 534 lbs. of fat, in 305 days. Her sire, Brampton Basil Ward, has recently qualified as a Superior Sire, the fifteenth son of Brampton Basileus to do so.

An imported heifer, Brampton Lucky Chance, 180025, completed a two year old record on three times milking. In 265 days, she produced 7,851 lbs. of milk, 391 lbs. of fat, with a test of 4.98 per cent. She is owned and tested by B. H. Bull & Son. On two times milking Cluny Castle Volunteer May 2nd, 171859, produced 8,345 lbs. of milk, 424 lbs. of fat, with a test of 5.08 per cent, for M. Alexander, Norval. In 305 days, Inniscarra Smilax Sarong, 175495, completed a record of 6,773 lbs. of milk, 367 lbs. of fat, with a test of 5.71 per cent. She is bred and owned by Mrs. Alice Hawkes Robinson, Newmarket.

Other herds represented were those of Don Head Farms, Richmond Hill; John F. Holtby, Malton; Alfred Bugg, Edgely; Gerald Graham, Georgetown; Estate of N. L. Nathanson, Maple; John L. Domelle, Brampton, and George Hewer, Moffat.
