Percy Buck, a returned missionary from Bolivia, Dr. Lyle Bristol of McMaster University, Dr. H. H. Bingham, general secretary of Ontario and Quebec Baptist churches, Rev. T. B. McDormond, editor of the Canadian Baptist, and Rev. W. J. McDonald, superintendent of home missions. The ladies of the church served meals both days.

BAPTIST CHURCH HIGHLIGHTS

Only one service was held at the Baptist Church last Sunday, the evening service being withdrawn so members could attend the anniversary at Knox Presbyterian Church. Rev. C. R. Gower took his morning text from the book of Amos, where God revealed to the prophet that he would destroy the vegetation with grasshoppers. Amos' prayer not to do so was answered, the Lord saying: "Behold I will set a plumbline in the midst of my people Israel: I will not again pass them by." Christ is the plumbline and the pattern, said Mr. Gower, and churches today are dying of sleeping sickness, asleep to the things of God. He pointed out four needs of the church today — reconsecration of professing Christians, awaiting on God for an outpouring of His spirit, pleading with sinners to repent and giving ourselves to the task of building His kingdom. The choir sang as an anthem "The King of Glory."

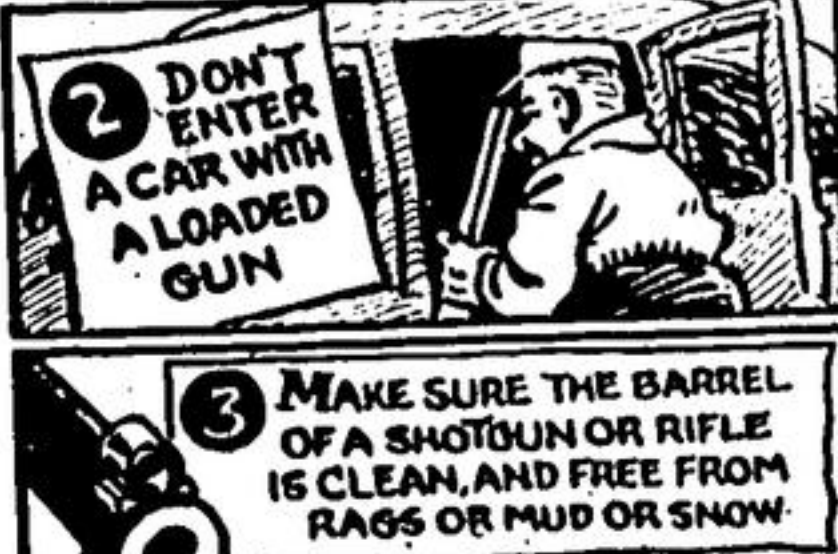
