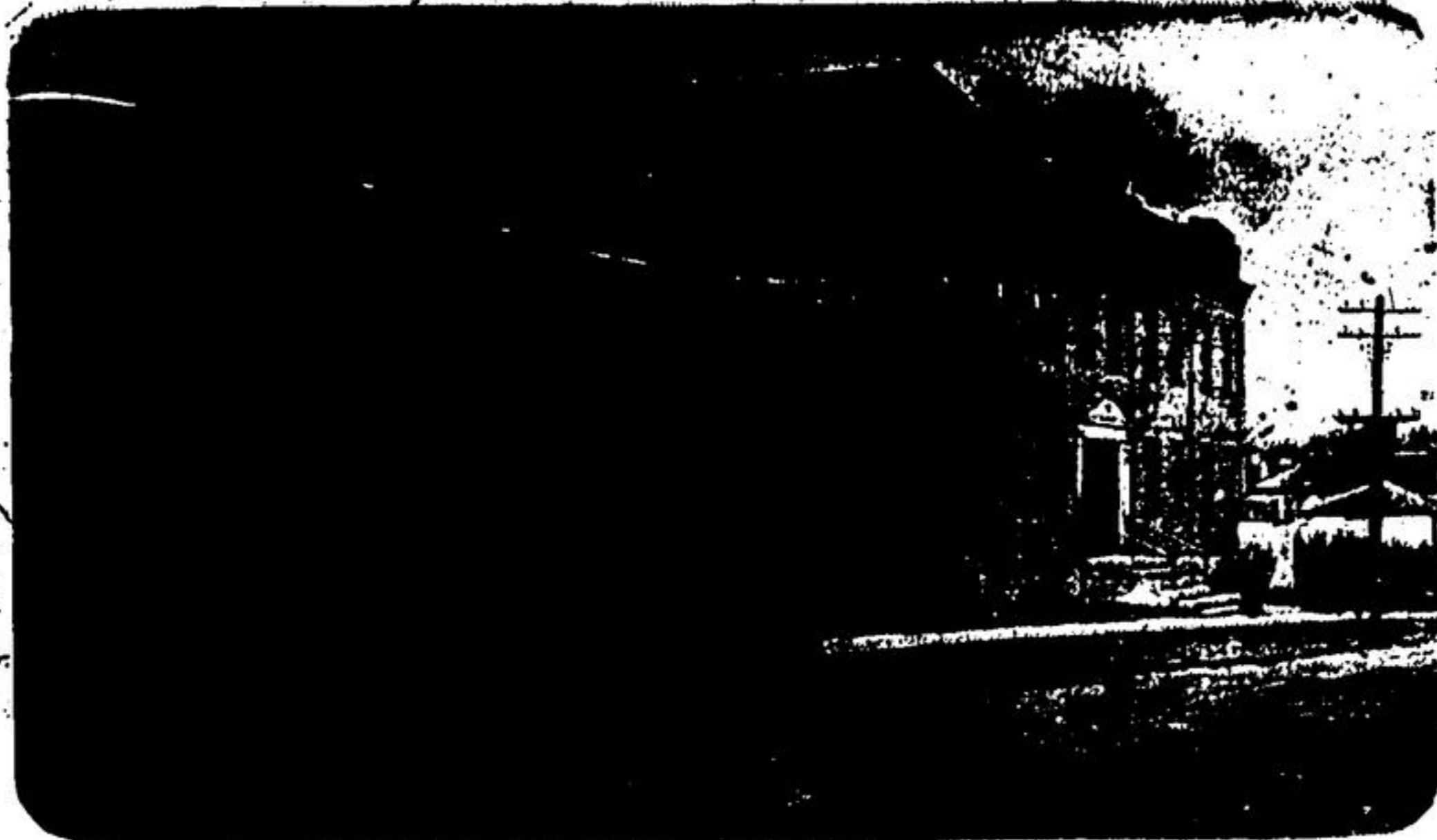

**Many Improvements to Arena Building**



Georgetown Arena is already a hive of activity now that artificial ice is available. As well as local skating and hockey practices, a number of outside teams have been making use of the ice and another good season seems to be shaping up. With new arenas being built in Brampton and Weston, and a possibility of one at Oakville, plus the fact that Milton now has artificial ice, this may be the last year when a large amount of money will come from rental to outsiders and the Board of Parks Management is doing everything possible to have these outside

teams help pay off the capital debt. Last year the parks board was able to pay off the first and last instalments on the \$30,000 debenture, a total of \$7,000 plus the interest saving. While only one payment comes due each year from now on, any extra money realized can be reinvested and the interest used. The arena building has had a complete face-lifting for the new season. The Rose Room has been redecorated and the walls and stairways built up with plywood. New floors have been laid in the main rotunda and in the ladies' dressing room and additional sanitary

facilities provided in the ladies' room. The Georgetown players' dressing room has been remodelled and a new shower and new lockers added. Last year it was not possible to paint the seats in the arena, and this has been done during the summer. Entering the arena, the left section is green, the right section blue, and the end seats are gray. Numbered seats will be available for about 1500 spectators. Concrete walks have been laid in the tunnels at the sides and new light shades for the lights over the ice surface are planned.
