**BY-LAW NO. 4812**

**Town of Georgetown**

A By-law revising the existing water rates in the Town of Georgetown.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council has adopted the recommendations of Dineen, Phillips & Roberts, consulting engineers, with reference to a rehabilitation program for water services in the Town of Georgetown.

AND WHEREAS pursuant to this recommendation the Corporation have applied for permission to issue debentures to the extent of EIGHTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$18,000.00).

AND WHEREAS it is provided by Section 407 of the Ontario Municipal Act that the approval of this expenditure is conditional on the Ontario Municipal Board being satisfied that the increased revenue derived from the water rates in the Town of Georgetown will be sufficient to meet this commitment.

NOW THEREFORE, The Municipal Council or the Corporation of Georgetown, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That all existing by-laws and any amendments thereto, relative to the amount to be payable for water rates, are hereby repealed.
2. The following rates shall be chargeable from and after the 31st day of December, 1948, for all water services operated in the Town of Georgetown:

Consumptive Charge: Rate per 1000 gals. Gallons per month

1. First 3,000 gallons or less — Minimum bill as per service charge
2. 3,000-10,000 monthly 0.20
3. 10,000-50,000 monthly 0.17
4. 50,000-100,000 monthly 0.15
5. 100,000-250,000 monthly 0.13
6. All over 250,000 monthly 0.11

Service to Consumers Outside Municipality

Charges to individuals outside the Municipality shall be classified and charged at the same rate as consumers inside the Municipality plus 100%.

Service charges for Private Fire Protection Lines Shall Be:

3. All tenants shall pay a deposit of \$5.00 before being supplied with water in the Town of Georgetown. The deposit of \$5.00 to be refunded on the termination of the service.

4. All the above rates shall be subject to the discount as fixed from time to time by the Municipal Council.

to; good clean chords and precision. Nice change bar 3. Chords are quite clear. Tone is good. Don't be abrupt with the 8th note followed by the 8th reats. Nice final four bars. Tempo di Valse; nice accompt. melody stands out clearly. Clars. good. Tempo is good. Nice nuance in bar 7, etc. Band sounds good from bar 19: Intonation is quite good; there is a trace of fault in the upper register. Nice 1st: Mono Mosso: band sounds good. Nice nuance in bars 3-4, but you did not carry it through. Andante con Moto: Nice introduction. 1st: Solo: Quartette: nice playing indeed. Nice expression: nice releases: chord changes nicely together. You nearly missed the nuance in bars 7-8; otherwise very well played indeed. Piu Mosso: very nice playing indeed. Correct playing of the staccatos, which were not abrupt. A little more nuance in bar 6. Very nice playing indeed. Nice Cres. into bar 13. All chords nice and clear. Bar 16, a little faulty intonation leading into Tempo 1. Good playing from Tempo 1: nicely sustained; nice Sostenuto; very good Bass indeed all through; very nice musical playing. Tempo di Marcia: Double bar, nice thirds. Just an occasional raggedness in the 16th notes. Bass solo, etc. very well played indeed. I think your Diminuendo was too abrupt in bar 15; otherwise the movement was very well played. Very well played indeed. Andante con Moto: nice introduction. Andante con Sost: Baritone solo very well played indeed. Accompt. is good. Your tempo is a shade slow for best effect. Andante does not mean slow. It means moving along steadily. Otherwise the movement very well played indeed. Nice chords in bar 7. Very nice indeed, bars 13-14. Nice chord in 14. Intonation a little faulty at bars 15-16. Second time Corset-Baritone combination, nice indeed. Cornet nice tone. Nice combination indeed; they both suit well together and the accompt. is very good. Balance is good. Nice precision in release all through this movement. Very good movement. Tempo di Marcia; more good playing. Maestoso: fine volume; good precision in attack and releases. Well played indeed. The 8th notes were better than in the introduction. Good strong finish. Good final chord indeed.

**SUMMARY:** A fine band indeed. Strong in all points. Just a shade of faulty intonation occasionally. Balance, ensemble good indeed, especially in accompt. to solos. General style good indeed. Nice phrasing. Generally good management of nuances. Much good musical playing. Technic very good. Precision in both attack and release very good. Good general correctness in notes and rhythms. Tempi generally good. More than a good performance. A SPLENDID PERFORMANCE!
