Too many letters and ads last week for me to find space, but I want to have one final word on the General Vote topic. . . . At the nomination meeting, a councillor took the editor to task, but his arguments were still the "horse and buggy" ones used for years to help maintain this ward system of voting. . . . Just look at the daily papers and see how few towns of similar and much larger size, use a ward vote system. . . . Don't you think it is most unfair that because John Doe owns property in

all three of the present wards he should be permitted to vote for councillors in all three wards, while Joe Soap who owns just as much or more property all in one ward can vote only in that ward. . . . That certainly isn't the democratic way. . . . He also suggested that one district might supply all the candidates. . . . this is impossible if voters use their franchise. . . . another of the points supposedly in favour of the Ward system is the economy of a Ward by-election as opposed to a complete Town by-election. . . . The difference in cost would be very little and why shouldn't this small extra amount be spent to enable those in other sections of Town to express their approval or disapproval of ANY candidate who runs for public office. . . . In this present election you who have only one ballot can do absolutely nothing about naming four of the six candidates for Councillor. . . . This is most unfair don't you think. . . . after all those four will be spending your tax money just the same as the two for whom you have voted.

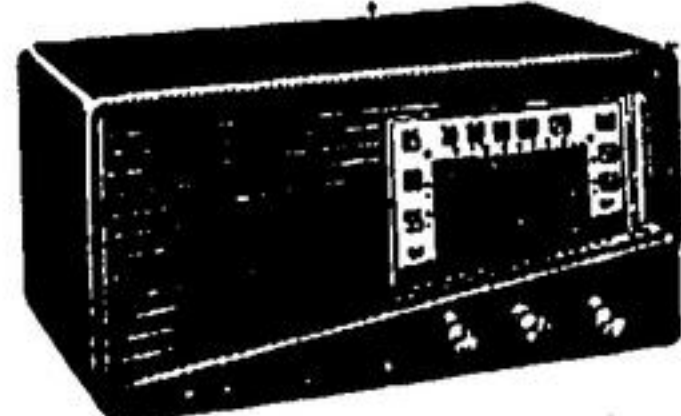

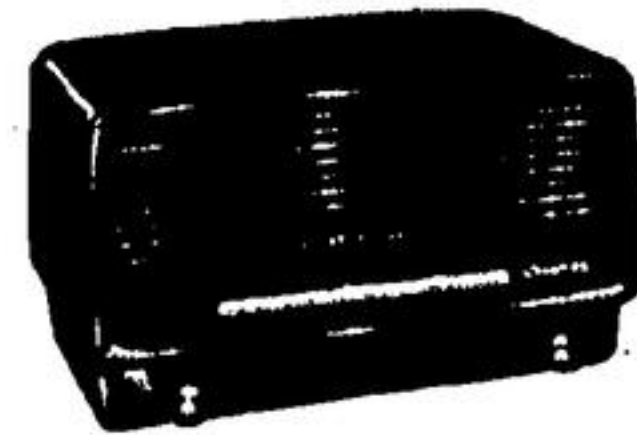

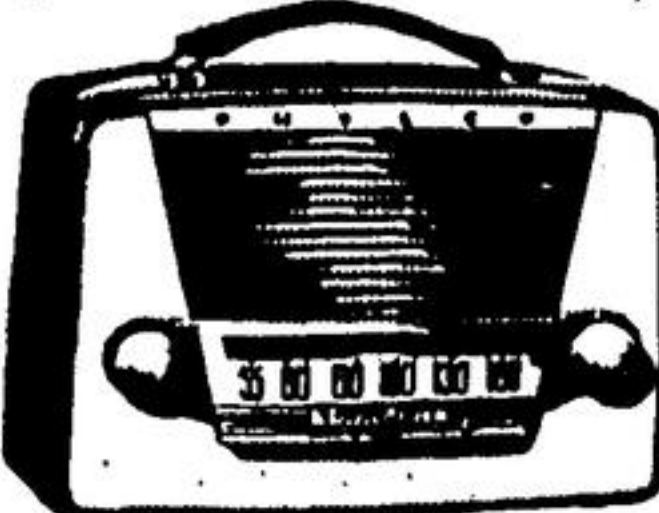
