PUBLIC SCHOOL NEWS

Approximately thirty-five pupils are absent due to the epidemic of mumps, with the classes of Miss Mildred Easton and Miss Marie Lindsay showing the most marked losses in attendance.

Winter examinations are in progress in the various classrooms with distribution of report cards scheduled for February 15th.

Three new slate blackboards are being installed at the school. The pupils of Miss Hazel Harrison, Miss Norma Wetherhead, and Miss Wilma Stull will benefit from these.

Many new books, ordered through the kindly consideration of the school board, have arrived and are being used and greatly enjoyed by the pupils. It is hoped that the use of them will enlarge the children's vocabularies, and improve the English status in the school.

Films to be shown at the school this week are as follows: A social study feature portraying the voyages of Christopher Columbus, also a junior film in technicolor of "The Zoo" for junior nature study.

Principal H. C. Wrigglesworth attended a meeting of the principals of Halton's urban schools on January 10th at Milton. Organization and management of urban schools was the chief topic under discussion. Valuable ideas were garnered there.

A visit to one of Georgetown's industrial plants, Smith and Stone Ltd., has been planned for Friday, January 20th, when the pupils of Grade 8 will tour the plant. This is part of the Vocational Guidance programme designed to help each individual pupil to understand various types of work before choosing a career.

A 45-minute concert is to be presented to the pupils of the two local schools on Monday, January 23rd at 11 a.m. in the United Church Sunday School Hall. A programme of vocal and piano selections by a Canadian family, that of Mr. Davison, promises to be very interesting. Parents of school children are also welcome. A nominal charge will be made to cover the expenses. It is believed that such a concert will be a beneficial addition to the children's musical education.

The Department of Education in cooperation with the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation is presenting a series of ten broadcasts each Wednesday morning from 9.45 until 10.15 a.m. over CBL, with G. R. Fenwick, Mus. Bac., as commentator, Geoffrey Waddington as musical director, and Terrence Gibbs as producer. The first of the series "Men Who Write Music" was heard on January 11th by the senior grades. Others to follow are entitled "Story Music", "Pure Music", "National Music", "Music Changes with the Years", "Rhythm and Melody", "Harmony", "Dance Music", "The Ballet", and a final "Review" on March 15th when the pupils will hear the Toronto Symphony Orchestra conducted by Sir Ernest MacMillan.

A series of five broadcasts suitable for Grades 1 to 3 are also being conducted on Monday mornings 9.45 until 10.00 a.m. from Jan. 9th until February 6th when selections from "High Road of Song" are being heard.
