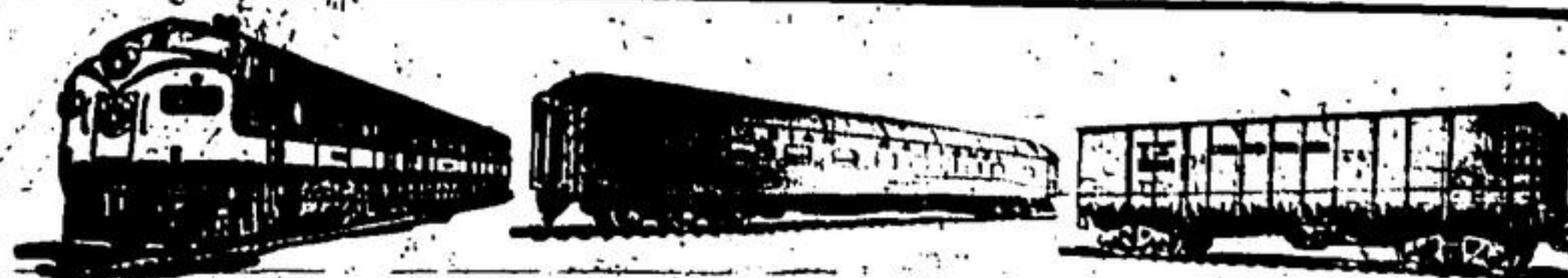

Modern Equipment Added To Canadian National Fleet



CNR is biggest user of diesel locomotive power in Canada. System total is now 148 units and 25 additional are on order. Road diesel are being tested in transcontinental passenger service.

Thirty-eight units of modern sleeping car equipment and lounge cars were added to service in 1949, and 79 are scheduled for this year. CNR carried 19 million revenue passengers last year.

More than 2900 new freight car units were added to service in 1949. New equipment included gondolas, triple hoppers, reefers, tank, box and automobile cars. CNR moved nearly 27 million revenue tons of freight last year.
