Merchants Elect 1950 Officers

The first meeting this year of the Retail Merchants Association was held last Wednesday at Hunter's Inn, a business meeting following evening dinner. A six-man executive committee, which will later choose a chairman and other officers from among its members was elected. The committee is composed of James Gaudlet, Richard Libotte, Eric Rawson, Graham Parson, Jack Colton and Walter Blehn. Frank Dunper was re-elected secretary and Fred Chapman treasurer. Mr. Libotte, who acted as chairman, reviewed the success of the organization to date which had been instrumental in having a motor licence bureau and a liquor store established here. Signs have also been erected on the highway indicating the business district of town. A project on the agenda to have waste disposal containers placed on Main Street was referred to the executive for a report at the next meeting. Sid Silver and Harold McClure were appointed to investigate placing of suitable signs at the entrances to town and to contact the Department of Highways to have signs pointing to Georgetown at various places in the province. A vote was taken on whether members would favour a nine o'clock Saturday closing hour, provided that Brampton, Acton and Milton did the same. The association favours this and organizations in those towns will be contacted about it. Another suggestion was that a crest be devised and window stickers ordered for members. The executive was asked to draw up a set of by-laws for submission for discussion at the next meeting. Another suggestion was that a credit bureau be established here, but no action was taken on this for the present.
