

St. Alban's Vestry

The Annual Vestry meeting of St. Alban's Church, Glen Williams was held in the Parish Hall on Monday evening, January 30th, postponed from the previous Tuesday, because of the weather. The Rector, Archdeacon W. G. O. Thompson, presided, and opened the meeting with Scripture, Creed, and prayers. A good representation of the congregation was present. The Minutes of last vestry were read by Mr. Arthur Beaumont, Vestry Clerk, and adopted.

The Churchwardens' financial statement was presented by Mr. Montague Merryday, and showed the church in good condition. Mr. Merryday commented on various items and answered questions. The fairness of the school board in their relations with St. Alban's, while the school is making use of the Parish Hall, was mentioned. The report was adopted, on motion by the wardens.

The report of St. Alban's Guild was presented by the treasurer, Mrs. Wm. Korzack, and showed a year of excellent work and splendid returns. Various comments were made in cordial appreciation of the Guild's services to the Church, and their financing of improvements to the property.

The report of the Sunday School presented by Mrs. J. R. Williams showed a pleasing increase in the number of scholars, a comfortable condition financially, and devoted service on the part of the staff. Various members of the Vestry offered appreciation.

The Rector presented his report from the registers, which showed five baptisms and three burials. The names of the departed were read, while the people stood, and a prayer was offered. The Archdeacon spoke with appreciation of the services of Churchwardens, Guild, and Sunday School staff, and all who had served the Church. He spoke of the coming confirmation and the first official visit of the new Bishop, Right Reverend Dr. Bagnall. He also called upon the people for their continued support of the Church.

The election then took place, with the following results: Rector's Warden, Mr. Montague Merryday; People's Warden, Mr. Arthur Beaumont; Sidesmen, Messrs. Wm. Korzack, John Eason, Leslie Young, John Crawford Jr., Robert Eason, A. Hancock, George Preston, Herbert Preston, Jack Beaumont, Jos. Eason, M. Beaumont, H. Tracey, J. Crawford, Sr., Wm. Beaumont, Thos. Hill, Cep. Sargent, Chas. Crawford.

Board of Management, Messrs. John Eason, Wm. Korzack, E. Budd, R. Haines, J. Crawford, Jos. Eason, W. H. Beaumont, R. Eason, M. Beaumont, Geo. Sargent, Jack Lucas, Mrs. Wagstaffe and Mrs. Eason.

Mr. Merryday reported as to insurance, that there was \$18,000 on the church, and \$2,000 on the parish hall.

The motion authorizing the Churchwardens to conduct business with the bank was passed, as was the Rector's transportation allowance.

The Rector thanked the people for their good attendance, and the Guild, in anticipation, for the welcome refreshments they were about to serve.

The Vestry adjourned, and the Rector pronounced the benediction, after which a pleasant half-hour was spent over a good cup of tea.
