Frank Early Wins Caribbean Cruise.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Early of Brampton have left by motor for New Orleans where on March 18th they will embark on a 12-day cruise in the Caribbean Sea.

AT ESQUERING COUNCIL ON MONDAY, MARCH 6th

A large number of foxes still continue to be shot in the township and payments of \$5 a fox under the county by-law amounted to \$260. Melvin Sheppard, Acton, shot 10 and was paid \$95. Charles Alexander, Milton, received \$25, and Frank Jones, Acton, \$20. Fifteen dollar payments went to Clifford, Stover, Milton, John Chisholm, Acton and Harold Deforest, Terra Cotta. Ten dollar payments to Harvey Nurse, William Emmerston, Jr., Georgetown; Glenn Saunders, Hornby; Charles Sheppard, Terra Cotta; Harry Hilson, Milton. Single foxes were shot by Chester Melanson, Georgetown; Gilbert Preston, Glen Williams; Edward Robertson, Hornby; Donald McLean, Gerald Downs, Milton.

A sheep claim of \$33 was paid to Walter Lawson for one sheep killed and one injured with a \$4 valuator fee to A. N. Stark.

The salary of the road superintendent, W. E. Townsend was increased from \$1500 to \$1800 yearly, and a by-law passed embodying this change.

The clerk was instructed to prepare a by-law regulating the load limit on certain bridges in the township.

Road accounts amounted to \$3375 and relief was \$67.
