### News and Views For Halton Farmers

#### SPECIAL MEETING OF HALTON DAIRYMEN

Eighty-one Halton dairymen have now made application for enrolment under the Dairy Herd Improvement Policy. Another 29 dairymen have their applications in and will likely get under way shortly. A meeting in the interest of dairy herd improvement work is to be held in the Court House, Milton, on Friday, March 31st, at 1:30 p.m. Cliff Morrow of the Ontario Live Stock Branch, Toronto, who is in charge of the DHIA work throughout Ontario is scheduled to address the meeting. Frank King, whom many Halton breeders will recall in connection with ROP work and now with the Halton Purlna Co. will give an illustrated address on the management programme for dairy and milking females; control of mastitis and breeding troubles; loafing barnes, etc. In short, it should be an interesting afternoon's programme and all Halton dairymen are invited to attend.

#### GEO. CURRIE NEW HALTON CONSERVATION CHAIRMAN

At a recent meeting of the Halton Conservation Committee, Reeve Geo. Currie of Esquesing Township and Chairman of the Agriculture and Reformation Committee of the Halton County Council, was appointed chairman of the Halton Conservation Committee.

The pond site established last fall on the Paul Fisher property, west of Nelson, is reported to cover an area of some four acres and has a depth of four to five feet of water near the dam. It will be interesting to note what effect this pond will have on the springs which arise below the pond and escarpment. Representatives of the Halton Sportsmen's Ass'n. who were responsible for the releasing of some four beaver in Nassagaweya Township reported another reservoir of water created as a result of the beaver's activity.

Plans are under way to bring Prof. Coventry of the Department of Biology, University of Toronto, who has made a special study of this area of Ontario, to the County next spring. It is anticipated Prof. Coventry will assist the Committee in selecting suitable areas for reforestation work. These areas will be selected where the headwaters of some of Halton's main streams arise. A public meeting with Prof. Coventry as the speaker will be held on the occasion of his visit.

#### JERSEY BREEDERS HOLD SOCIAL EVENING

The Stewarttown Hall on Thursday evening last was the scene of the second annual social evening sponsored by the Halton Jersey Club. Over 100 guests were in attendance. President Duncan Moffat and his committee provided a most enjoyable evening's program. Mrs. Lindsay Ferguson of Rockwood and Stanley Matthews, of Acton, were the winners of the prizes in progressive euchre. Following lunch the remainder of the evening was spent in dancing to music supplied by May's Orchestra.
