Barber Industries has moved to a new location in the rear part of the building on Main Street which houses the Georgetown Dairy. The firm will occupy the premises where Emmerson Brothers Tool & Die was formerly located. The building is owned by Riley Brethour, former dairy proprietor.

Barber Industries, which produces silk-screen process printing, manufactures a variety of display advertising products. At present they are producing large quantities of real estate signs. They are also the only manufacturers in Canada of pin-block flower holders. The firm was started three years ago by two brothers, Bob and Paul Barber and operated for a time in the upstairs of Ken McMillan's farm machine building on the highway, later moving to Bob Barber's home. Three men are employed at the present time, Allan Teeter, George Pellétier and Ken Moore of Terra Cotta.
