**Merchants Ask Angle Parking Be Restored**  
At a dinner meeting of the Retail Merchants' Association last Wednesday at Ret's, president James Goodlet was delegated to ask the town council to change parking regulations on Main Street. Several members reported complaints from shoppers about the parallel parking which is being tried as an experiment. The merchants are asking for angle parking on Main Street, except for the block between the hotel and Cordaro and for the establishment of a one-way street on Hill from the bank to the Legion Hall, with angle parking on one side.  
The public are making good use of the new waste disposal containers on Main Street and it was decided to obtain four more to be placed in strategic locations.  
Graham Farrell, who is hydro-chairman, said that new lighting standards to provide better light on Main Street would cost over \$750 and the hydro commission could not make this expenditure at the present time when they were trying to keep rates from increasing.  
The group decided to remain open on the Thursday before Good Friday until 6.30 p.m.  
A few months ago the merchants agreed on a 9 o'clock Saturday closing, providing neighbouring towns could be persuaded to do the same. So far Brampton and Hillsburgh have indicated their approval and Acton and Erin have it under consideration. There is no merchants organization in Milton and it is difficult to get an expression of opinion from that town.
