Tuesday evening meeting once more — and we opened with games and "20 Questions" followed by business and the devotional service led by Mrs. C. J. Buck.

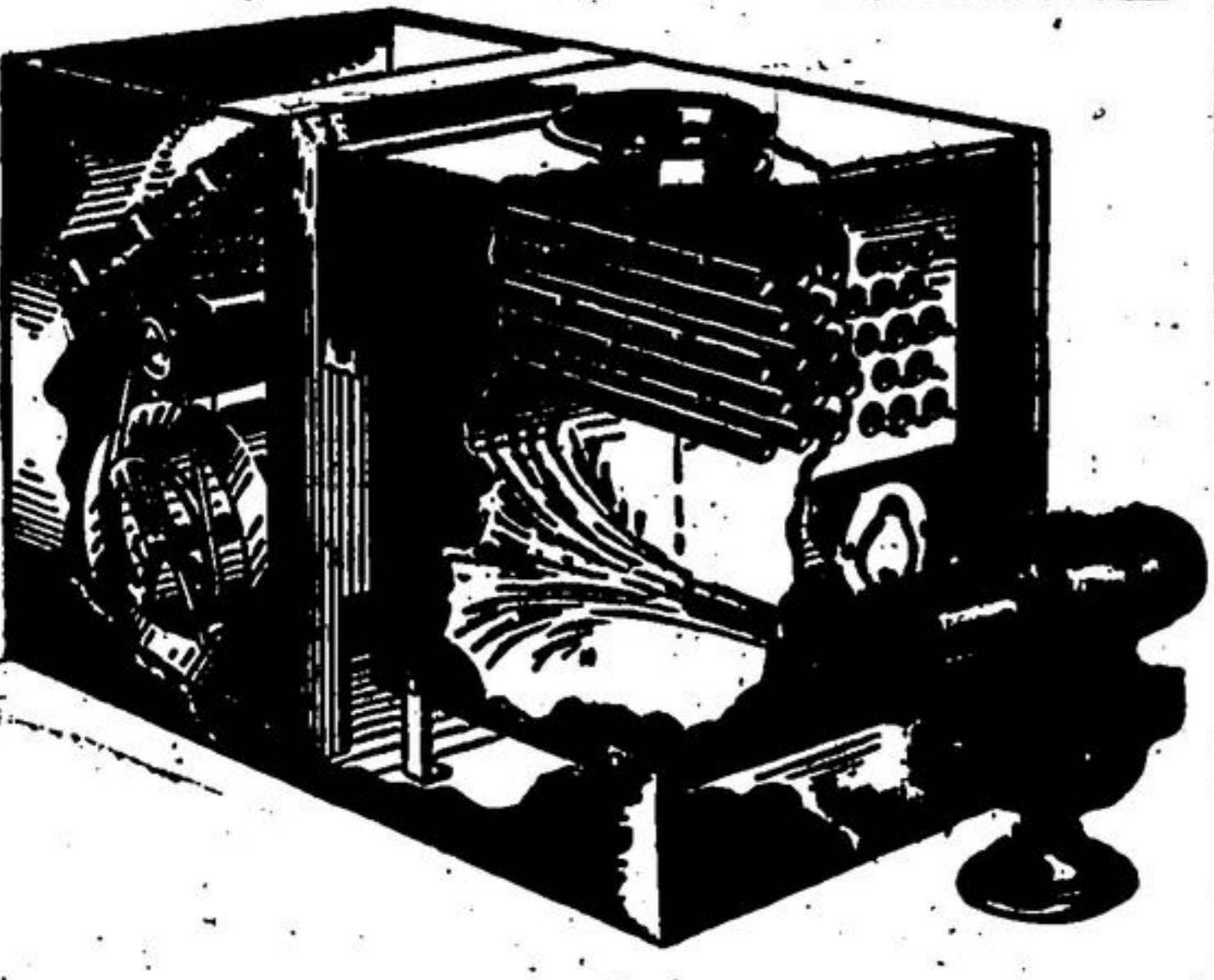
