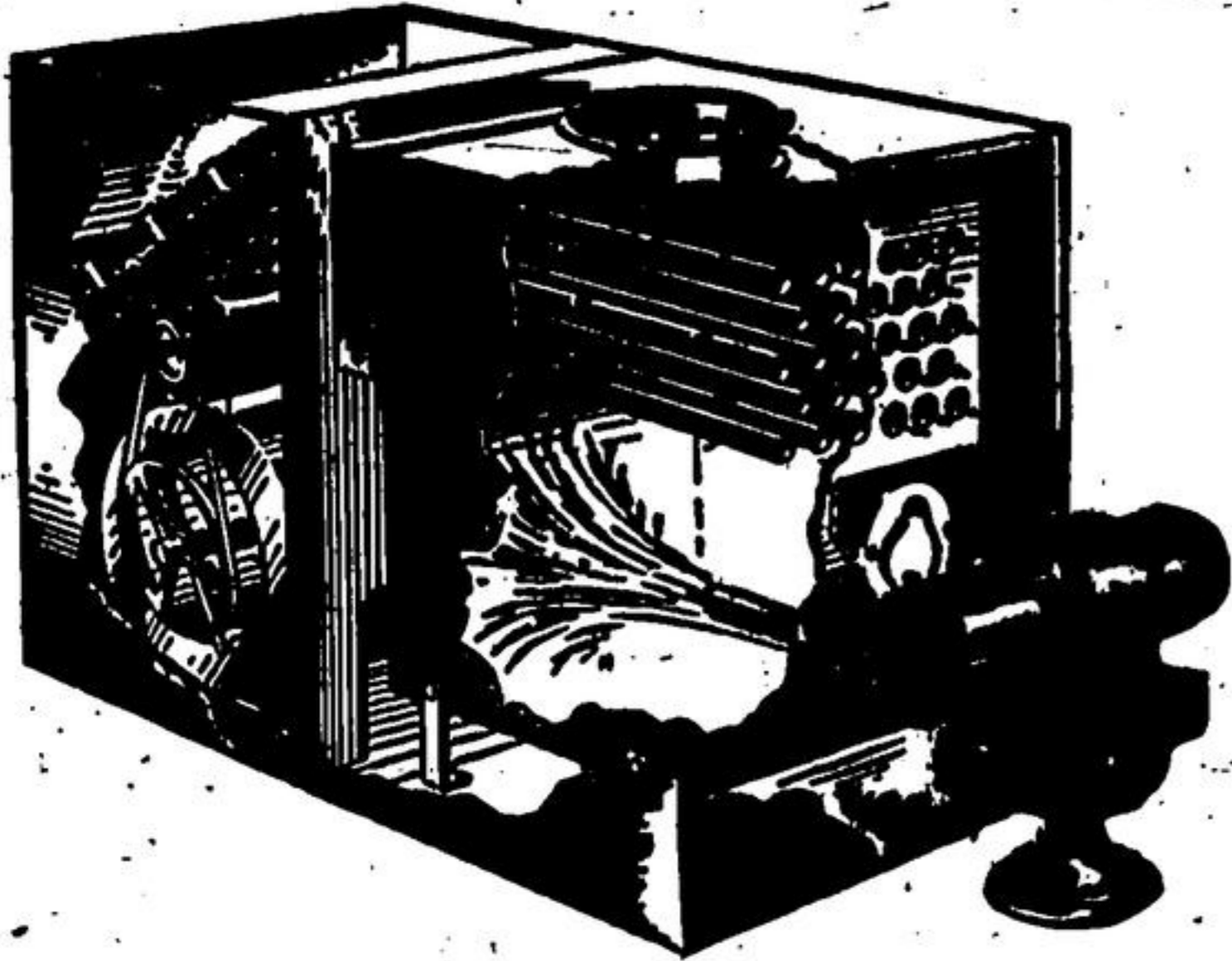

Burns Cause Death of A. E. Cripps' Mother

A tragic accident in Acton last week took the life of Mrs. Edwin Cripps, mother of Mr. Alger Cripps of Georgetown. Mrs. Cripps was pouring cooking grease from one vessel to another when it ignited from the stove and set fire to her clothing. Alone at the time, she ran from her home on Mill Street, and her plight was noticed by men at Thompson Motors who rushed to her assistance and extinguished the fire. Taken to Guelph General Hospital she died the next day from burns and shock.

Born at Eden Mills 79 years ago, Sarah Jane Moore was a daughter of the late Henry and Matilda Moore. For thirty years Mr. and Mrs. Cripps farmed in Eramosa and 27 years ago moved to Acton, where Mr. Cripps died in 1947.

Four sons and three daughters survive, Stanley, Cecil, and Henry of Acton, Alger of Georgetown, Mrs. J. McIntyre (Tillie) and Mrs. Reta Lincoln, Toronto, and Mrs. Edna Welch of Englehart. Twenty-nine grandchildren, 5 great grandchildren, and two brothers, Henry and John, both of Guelph, also survive.

The funeral service in Acton was conducted by Mr. A. W. Joyce, Toronto and Mr. A. M. Gratton, London. Interment was in Acton Cemetery. Pallbearers were Ken Cotton, Ballinacra, William Coulson, Fergus, Gordon Steen, Toronto, Arthur Moore, Guelph, Fred Cleave and Darwin Cripps, Acton. Flower bearers were three grandchildren, Bert Allan and Ron and Fred Cripps and a nephew, William Moore.

ACTON LADY WAS WELL-KNOWN MUSICIAN

An accomplished musician and a keen participator in sports in her earlier years, Lottie V. Mason died suddenly in Acton last week. She was a twin daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Mason. Her twin sister, Hazel, died suddenly a few years ago when she was giving a musical number at an event in Acton Town Hall. The sisters were inseparable companions and since the passing of her sister, Miss Mason felt keenly the loss sustained.
