**Canon H. Leigh Pink Goes to California**

A former Anglican rector at Norval, Stewarttown and Hornby, Canon Harry Leigh Pink has accepted a call to be rector of Navy Family Chapel at Long Beach, California. He will take up his new position on June 1st.

Canon Leigh Pink left his parish here in September, 1947, to go to Grand Rapids, Michigan, where he has been canon residentiary of St. Mark's Cathedral. A native of England, he came to Canada in 1938.

Navy Family Chapel is described by him as one of the finest places of missionary work on this continent. It was founded in 1940 by Cmdr. Truman Riddle, retired navy chaplain, to meet the needs of a place to worship for the families of officers and enlisted men.

Cmdr. Riddle held his first Easter services in the back garden of his Long Beach bungalow, with a chair in borrowed vestments seated on the steps of a stable in the garden. The service was attended by 250 navy persons and this led to the building of a fine chapel on West Ocean Blvd. in Long Beach.

In the intervening nine years the chapel has gained 1274 new members, acquired five buildings, and has made contacts with 30,000 navy wives and children and served hundreds of families with free clothing and groceries.

The Lions Club is planning their usual banquet for the winning minor hockey teams. No date has been set but it is expected that it will be sometime in May.


