**"Conversion" Sermon Topic At St. John's Sunday**

Regular morning worship was conducted in St. John's United Church on Sunday by the Minister, Rev. John M. Smith. The lesson was read from St. John's Gospel and the Test from Acts. Mr. Smith had as his subject the word "Conversion." He emphasized the fact that while the word "conversion" had been misused and abused causing people to shy away from the church, the experience which it was intended to convey, the essential features of this experience, he said, were not always the same but the inward reconciliation of man to his God came about in various manners. Mrs. Wrigglesworth sang the solo "I Shall Not Pass Again This Way."


