Salary Schedule For High School Teachers

\$3500 is Maximum in Three District Schools

A salary schedule for teachers in Georgetown, Milton and Acton high schools was adopted by North Halton District Board at its meeting Monday in Georgetown. The new schedule provides a salary of \$2100 to \$3500 for non-specialists and \$2200 to \$3600 for specialists on the staff, with an annual increment of \$100 until the maximum is reached. A new teacher coming on staff can benefit to the extent of \$800 for experience, and the board has a proviso that a teacher if unsatisfactory can be taken off schedule and that exceptions can be made if necessary in hiring a new teacher. Salaries of Principal J. L. Lambert, Georgetown and Principal Robbins, Acton were set at \$3900 and Principal Marcellus in Milton will receive \$4100.

A motion to rescind a motion made at the last meeting of agreement on a new basis of sharing costs between municipalities was lost. The Milton members said their town council would not agree to the new plan and they voted against it as well as the member from Nassagaweya.

A report by the commercial inspector said that unless at least fifteen students were enrolled in the special commercial course being taught in Georgetown, it would not be feasible to continue it. The board has hopes that next year there will be that many or more from the three schools interested in the course and will continue it at least for one more year.

Purchase of an acre and a half of garden land adjoining Milton school was approved. More land is necessary for the teaching of agriculture. The Georgetown principal complained that he had been unable to obtain a syllabus of the test pieces for Halton Music Festival and as a result Georgetown would make no entries this year. A complaint will be lodged with the festival association. Services of a member of the Acton teaching staff were dispensed with, payment being made until the end of June and Mrs. Robbins hired as replacement teacher until the end of the term.
