Salary Schedule For High School Teachers

\$3500 is Maximum in Three District Schools

A salary schedule for teachers in Georgetown, Milton and Acton high schools was adopted by North Halton District Board at Its meeting 'Monday in Georgetown ... The new schedule provides a salary of \$2100 to \$3500 - for non-specialists and \$2200 to \$3600 for specialists on the staff, with an annual increment of \$100 until the maximum is reached. A new tonoher coming on staff can benefit to the extent of \$500 for experience, and the Board has n proviso that a teacher if unsatisfactory, can be taken off schedule and that exceptions can be made if necessary in hiring a new teacher. Salaries of Principal J. L. Lambert, Georgetown and Principal Robbins, Acton were set at \$3800 and Principal Marcellus in Milion will roceive \$4100.

A motion to rescind a motion made at the last meeting for agreement on a new basis of sharing costs between municipalities was lost. The Milton members said their town council would not agree the new plan and they voted against it as well as the member from
