Scotch Block Native Was Niagara Lawyer

A native of the Scotch Block, Robert James Moore died in Buffalo General Hospital on Thursday, May 25th, after a year's illness. His death occurred on his 79th birthday. A son of the late William Moore and Catherine Stewart, he attended Waterloo Public School and Georgetown High School. After graduation he taught for three years, 1895 to 1897 at Stewarttown School, then entered the Law School at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, from which he graduated in 1900. He had practiced law ever since in Niagara Falls, N.Y. He was predeceased in 1944 by his wife, the former Jessie Elliot of Milton whom he married in 1905. One brother survives, Oliver Mount Moore who lives near Georgetown. The funeral service was held on Saturday in Niagara Falls with interment in Evergreen Cemetery, Milton.
