

It shows, on the other hand, that potatoes peeled before boiling lose 20 to 30 per cent of their vitamin C and less some thismine as well.

Boiling potatoes in their jackets -when potato and jacket are sound -is a good start toward serving them scalloped, mashed, creamed, or in other ways that are family favorites, say the bureau's food specialists.
