By-Law authorizing the borrowing of \$190,560.60 upon debentures for the erection of a six room pub-

WHEREAS the Public School Board has requisitioned the Council of the said Corporation to borrow, for the purpose of erecting a new public school containing six classtooms and an assembly hall as the present school is inadequate for our public school population and the as the rate of three and one-half per centum (314%) per annum, payable annually, and to provide for

to make the principal of the said debt repayable in annual instalments during the period of twenty years next after the date of issue of such debentures, of such amounts respectively that, with the interest in respect of the debt, the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in each year shall be as nearly as possible the same; subject to the statutory proviso that each instalment of principal may be for an even \$100,00, \$500.00 or. \$1,000.00, or multiple thereof, and, that notwithstanding anything herein contained, the annual instalments of principal and interest may differ in amount sufficienty to admit thereof.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the municipality, according to the last revised assessment roll thereof, is \$1,537,510.00.

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the Corporation, exclusive of local improvement debts secured by special rates or assessments, is \$540,899.00 and no part of the principal or interest of such debt is in arrear. AND WHEREAS by Order dated

the Ontario Municipal Board has approved the purpose of the said borrowing and the passing of all requisite by-laws, including debenture by-laws.

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPOLATION OF THE TOWN OF GEORGETOWN EN-ACTS AS FOI LOWS:

1. For the purpose aforesaid the Corporation shall borrow upon the credit of the Corporation a sum not exceeding One Hundred and Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$190,000) and shall issue debentures therefor in sums of not less than \$50.00 each. Each debenture shall bear interest at the rate of three and one-half per centum (31217) per annum, payable annually, and shall have coupons attached thereto for the payment of such interest.
