Trying to obtain interesting fishing news these days is grim work which accounts for the column being absent the odd week.

The Credit from the Forks down has produced some nice fish so far. That however, doesn't prove there are ample trout there. Most of those caught were on the large size.

The Browns rely strictly on restocking to keep their numbers up. Since they were first put in the Credit they have not been known to produce. This indicates that a new restocking program is needed. The Credit should also be made a sporting river with certain sections closed each year. The Department of Lands and Forests would be only too glad to help us out on this if they were notified.

There is an abundance of food such as minnows, crawfish and various nymphs such as mayflies, dragon flies, stone flies and crane flies. The nymphs provide good food early in the spring and on in June when they emerge as flies. Several good fly hatches have been noticed so far this month but not one fish was seen rising to take them. This speaks for itself!

MRS. LLOYD BARTH DIES IN LONDON

After a lengthy illness, Mrs. Lloyd Barth of Dorchester died in Victoria Hospital, London, on Sunday, June 18th. The former Kathleen Merritt, she was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Merritt of Brampton and was born in England in 1909, coming to Canada with her parents when she was two years old.
