Chatting . . . With **M.H.B.**

A WEEK AGO Saturday was a red letter day in the school year of the Grades Seven and Eight pupils of Glen Williams Public School . . . Kenneth Schenk, James Schenk, Gordon Preston, James Young, Barry Timleck, Eva Garyn, Elsie Larsen, Marie Gibbs, Roger Addy, and Blake Ingills (who, although now a High School pupil, went along to accompany his chum, Ken Schenk). . . under the supervision of their teacher, Mrs. Edna Beaumont, boarded the early morning bus to Toronto, to visit points of interest . . . In the past few years, this has become an annual custom. . . The sight of the Toronto subway under construction attracts the attention of hundreds who are no longer classifiable as children, so it was small wonder the Glen children watched in fascination as machine-power and man-power slowly but surely progressed with that enormous task on Yonge St. . . . A little later, a member of the T. Eaton Co. staff took the children on a tour through the store. The first visit was to Johnny, the Maclean in the Toy Department, who mystified and enchanted the boys and girls. . . In the Grocerteria, the class saw great varieties of food in orderly arrangements on shelves or in cold storage, all ready for the consumer. On another floor an interesting demonstration was in progress for the making of a "Pile Rug." The Sports and Garden Sections in the Main Store were also visited. . . In the College Street Store, the two main points of great interest were the "All Alumnium" Home and the Eaton Auditorium. While on the tour the children were given a special treat in the way of "frosting malted" cones and doughnuts—besides tickets for the Inter-Store bus. . .

AFTER LEAVING Eaton's, Mrs. Beaumont took the girls and boys for a walk to and through Queen's Park, where they saw life-size statues of Sir John A. Macdonald, George Brown and other Canadian statesmen studied in Social Studies. There was a little disappointment in the trip in that they were unable to visit the Legislative Assembly Room, since it is not open on Saturday mornings this year. . . Always a very important part of a visit to the city is "getting out" and the children certainly enjoyed their lunches at Murray's, on Bloor Street. . .

IN THE EARLY part of the afternoon Mrs. Beaumont took the class to the Royal Ontario Museum. . . Then later they took Bloor and Bay street cars to Casa Loma where they joined one of the parties conducted by a guide, for a tour of the castle. A "highlight" of the afternoon was when they mounted the winding stairs to the top of the Tower, from which a splendid view of the City and Lake is visible. On clear days, Brock's Monument may be seen from this Tower. . . Perhaps, if you're anything like us, you don't know too much about Casa Loma, in spite of the fact we live so near. Trips to the city seem to be always such rushed affairs, there's no time left for sight-seeing. We intend to go through Casa Loma some day tho', so were interested in the information about it on some of the souvenir cards of the tour. . . Built in 1913 by the late Major General Sir Henry Pellatt as a private residence, it became known as "Pellatt's Folly", when the family fortune became very much reduced. He had created his "dream castle," however, with legendary disregard for cost. It is reputed to have cost over \$3,000,000, and is built on the lines of French chateaux in the Loire district of Old France. It contains 98 rooms, 25 open fireplaces, and 15 bathrooms. Other features include stables which cost over \$200,000, a rifle range and a monster conservatory. It has been operated as a tea room, a hotel, and is now open daily from 10 a.m. to 5.30 p.m., to tourists and visitors, under the auspices of the West Toronto Kiwanis Club. . . An interesting local touch is supplied in that the stone used to build Casa Loma, is reputed to have come from the local quarries, then operated by the late Hugh Logan. . .

SATURDAY, JUNE 27, was Graduation Day for the Nursing Class of "Toronto East General Hospital, and among those graduating was Miss Mildred Adamson, sister of Mrs. William Hayward, George Street, St. C. and Mrs. Hayward attended the ceremonies, and were doubly proud when Mildred was awarded second prize for the highest standing in Bedside Nursing. . . You've doubtless read about the well-known Toronto theatrical group, the Earl Grey Players. . . are presenting a Shakespearean festival in Trinity College Quadrangle for four weeks. This group is composed of top-notch Canadian radio and stage actors, such as Lorne Greene and John Dramine, as well as some excellent English talent, so it was quite an honor for John Douglas, son of Mr. and Mrs. Byerson Douglas of town, to be chosen to act with the group. . . John, who attends Lawrence Park Collegiate and commutes every day with his father, from their home here, will gain some valuable experience from the Festival. He has been interested in dramatics since he made his first appearance on the stage at the age of ten years, and has done considerable dramatic work on the radio since that time, including parts on the children's program, the "Cuckoo Clock House." . . For the past year, John has been studying dramatics at the Conservatory in Toronto, with Clara Salisbury Baker. When the Shakespearean Festival is concluded, he will attend Starnale Bennett Theatre School in Toronto. . .
