Hydraulic Sorting Lifts Are First In Canada

Hydraulic sorting lifts, recently installed in the Georgetown mill of Provincial Paper, Ltd., are the first of their type in Canada according to an article in the current issue of The Barker, plant magazine.

Working on the same principle as service station lubrication lifts, they keep two skids, one sorted, the other unsorted, at a continuous level. This equalized platform reduces worker fatigue, is simple to operate and has little expense connected with its operation once installed.

Old methods required much more handling: The sheets had to be unloaded from the skid onto the sorting table, sorted and returned to the skid. Now they are trucked onto the platform, an empty skid placed beside them, the platform is depressed and the operator is ready to sort.

As the empty skid is loaded it can be lowered and the unsorted one raised, so that the level of the two is kept constant. The floor space occupied by the two platforms takes up no more room than original equipment and headroom on the level below is not interfered with.

The Georgetown mill's maintenance supervisor, John A. H. Feller and engineer, John MacDonald and Mr. Sheldene, were up in ballast at this time and found saving definite. It has proved its worth so well that other lifts will be installed at Georgetown and some are planned at Port Hope. The cost of additional capacity is lower because all lift features are built into the regular press and the capacity to


