now off the fields. In general the spring grain has turned out exceptionally well to the amount of straw. We may well be thankful that, in general, the barns and granaries present a much better picture to that of a year ago. The corn crop too, while later than normal, should result in most of the silos being filled. The preparation of land for fall wheat along with the taking off of second-crop alfalfa, is the next job. Quite a number are leaving second crop alfalfa hoping for some seed, but judging by the fields we have seen prospects for seed are not too promising. Due to the sprouting of wheat a good many are looking for fresh seed. It should not be necessary to point out the wisdom of only buying seed backed by government grade and germination test and don't forget to treat for smut, or if you don't like the job get your seed flank - udder well attached and cleaned and treated at the same desirable quality - level in floor time at Stewarttown or Ballinafad. GOING FISHING?



Now the fishing season is in fall swing. Now, too, is the time to remember, and observe, the fishing regulations. There's a reason for them.

The number of fish available for each season is estimated. The authorities then balance this against the expected number of fishermen to establish catch limits. This is done for your protection to provide a continuing supply of game fish for the future. To permit full growth, minimum lengths are set for various species of fish which may be taken.
