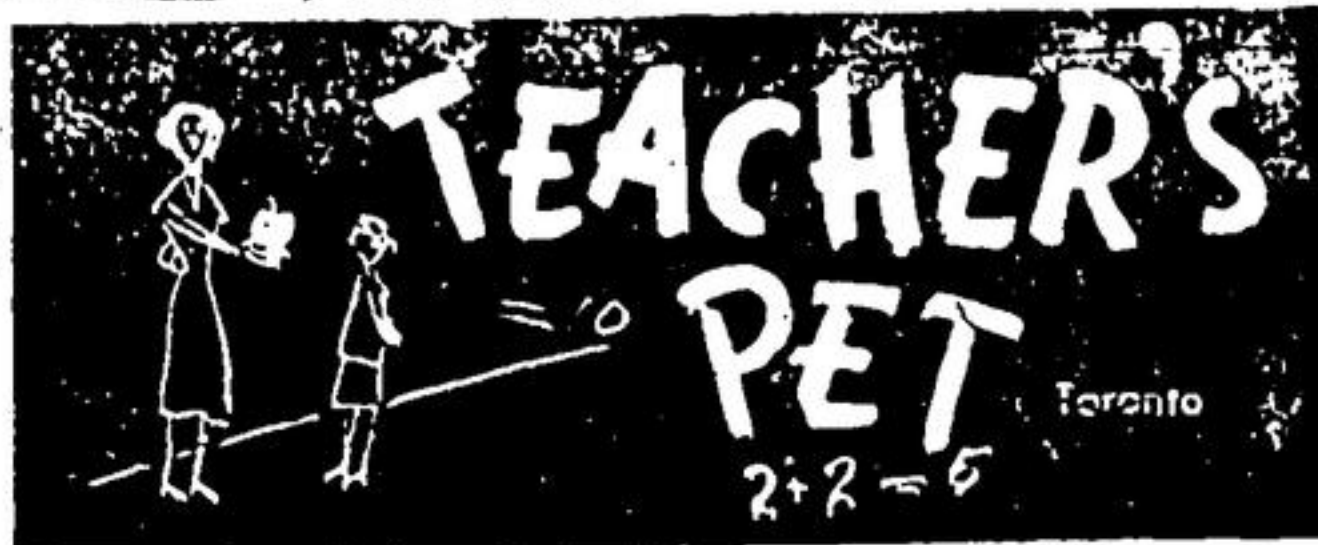

Sunset Farm, Georgetown, R. R. 2, operated by Corey, Herrington, & Sons, was one of the big winners in the Canadian National Exhibition poultry show. The Sunset Farm wins included five best displays, for which diplomas and bronze medals were awarded, and in the special prize or the best hen in the show, the Buff Orpington hen copied second.

In the final analysis a Buff Orpington hen was awarded second in the class.

Harvey Lacey also had a string of Show-Lovers and White Magenta Bantams. Clarence Rogers took top award in Honours, White Bearded Bantams. Fred Pulson, and Percy Clark & Son, were well to the fore with their Wyanhotters.
