HEALTH UNIT

Outbreak of Whooping Cough in This District

In recent weeks there has been an outbreak of whooping cough in the Acton, Georgetown, Esqueping area. Since September 23, 12 cases of the disease have been reported to the Halton County Health Unit, 7 in Acton, 2 in Esqueping and 3 in Georgetown.

The age distribution of the cases has been different from usual. Ordinarily, this disease attacks infants and pre-school children but many of the cases have been in older children. The number of cases, by age, is as follows:

Under 1 year	1
1-2 years	2
2-5 years	4
5-9 years	4
10 years and over	1

It has become increasingly difficult to diagnose this disease since, when the child has previously received protective inoculations of whooping cough vaccine, he rarely develops the characteristic "whoop." Rather, he shows a hard, continuous cough which may or may not end up by vomiting.

Any child with this type of cough should be seen by his family physician to determine whether whooping cough is present.

The disease is particularly dangerous to the infant and young child since pneumonia and other complications may develop. All infants and pre-school children should be given inoculations of whooping cough vaccine. With the number of cases now about, parents are strongly advised to have booster doses for their children if they have had the original course of inoculations. These inoculations may be obtained through the family physician or through the Child Health Centres, maintained by the Halton County Health Unit.

If the disease is diagnosed, the quarantine period for the case is 3 weeks. The house is placarded. There is no restriction placed on adults. Children over 12 may continue at school if they have no symptoms. Children under 12 are quarantined unless they can prove they have had a previous attack.

Ordinarily, whooping cough vaccine is not given to school age children but under the present circumstances, "booster" doses might be desirable. Parents are advised to seek the advice of the family physician in this regard.

Parents have two duties in the control of this outbreak: (1) to seek the advice of the family physician if there is suspicion that the child has whooping cough, (2) to protect infants and pre-school children by protective inoculations of whooping cough vaccine.
