Don't Want Central School Says Milton

Opposition to the building of one central high school to serve the five communities in North Halton was forcibly expressed by Milton council at their meeting recently. Members passed a motion which favoured operating two schools, one at Milton and a second which would be built in the northern part of the county.

The motion followed an interview with Dr. Rutherford, deputy-minister of education, by Reeve Kenneth Dick, Councillors MacNab and Anderson and the Milton members of North Halton High School District board.

Complete text of the motion was: "Whereas a consultative committee appointed by the county of Halton, by its report dated 2nd May, 1946, recommended as follows: A High School District composed of the town of Oakville and part of the township of Trafalgar; and a North Halton High School District to be composed of Acton, Georgetown, Milton, Esquesing, Nassagaweya and parts of the townships of Trafalgar and Nelson with a central school to be built in the vicinity of Speyside.

"And whereas subsequently thereto, the county of Halton by by-law did create the Oakville Trafalgar High School District to be composed of the town of Oakville and the whole of the Township of Trafalgar; and by by-law did create the Burlington-Nelson High School District to be comprised of the town of Burlington and the whole of the Township of Nelson; and by by-law did create the North Halton High School District to be comprised of Acton, Milton, Esquesing and Nassagaweya.

"And whereas in the month of July, 1949 at a meeting at the township of Esquesing municipal offices attended by representatives of the councils of Acton, Georgetown, Milton, Esquesing and Nassagaweya a resolution that the North Halton High School District operate two high schools—one in Milton and one in the north end of the county—was carried.

"And whereas subsequently thereto, the county of Halton by by-law added Georgetown to the North Halton High School District.

"And whereas of the five municipalities comprising the North Halton High School District, the town of Milton is the only municipality that has contributed to the North Halton High School District a modern school.

"And whereas neither the recommendation for a central school at Speyside as contained in the report of the consultative committee nor the resolution of the meeting in July, of 1949 in favour of the North Halton High School District Board operating two schools, has been carried out and the town of Milton no longer feels itself obligated to confirm to either.

"Now therefore, the corporation of the town of Milton resolves that it is opposed to the building of one central high school in the North Halton High School District but is in favour of the North Halton High School District Board continuing to operate the high school presently existing in Milton and a new school to be built in the north end of the county."
