**Clara Agnes Cole Buried here Friday**

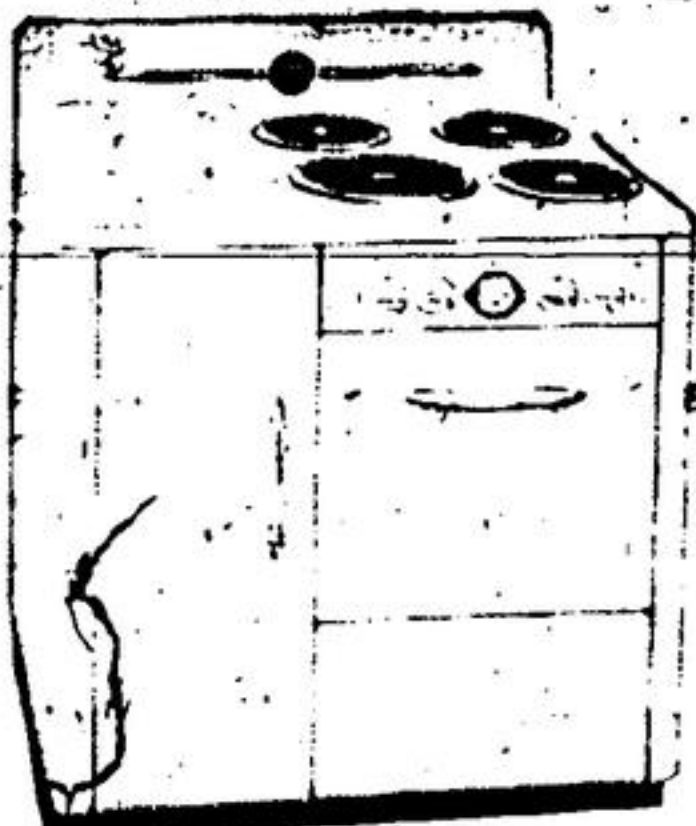
