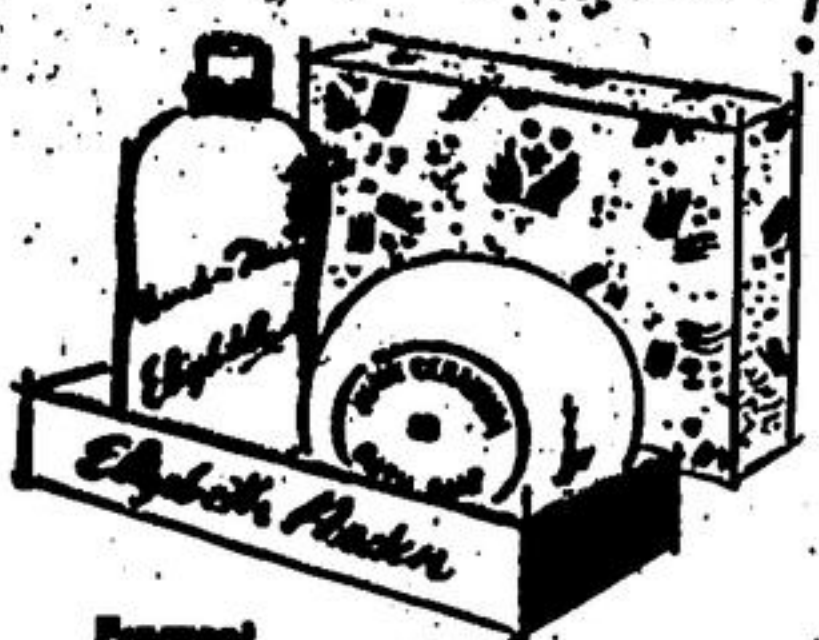

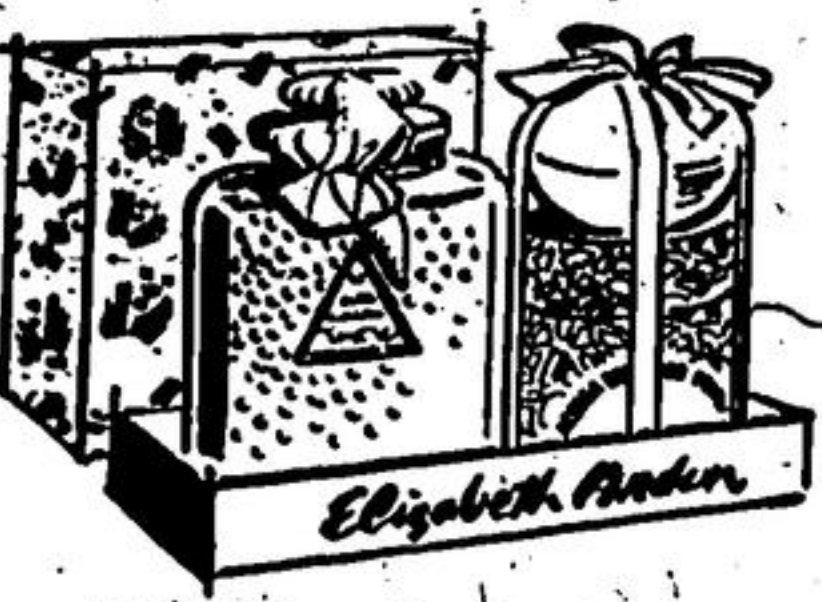

THE MIXING BOWL

Hello Homemakers! At this season school children are practicing songs for concerts and choir masters are debating the relative merits of old favourite carols for the Christmas service. The carol is one of the most ancient items of the Christmas program. Even the origin of the name is lost in obscurity, but the word comes from "Carolla", meaning circle, coronet and hence ring-dance. Today we go about our work quietly singing what was meant to be a rollicking song—or sing many a modern song until it is "thread-bare".

As you read this column you will look over the advertisements of the numerous gifts you might buy. According to the clerks in our shops the common question asked is, "What shall I buy for a four, five or six year old. And the favourite selection still seems to be blocks for the tots, then clay modelling, dolls, household equipment, crayons and paints. Mothers seem to shy away from mechanical noisemakers because they realize the din that makes her ears ring.

As for Christmas goodies, our suggestions of a moist Banana Loaf, delicately spiced Doughnuts and a never-fail sweet cake should please you. These taste like good homemade foods and can be made now and put on the shelf for the holiday or may be used now for the lunch box as they are inexpensive yet fragrant enough for the festive occasion.

TAKE A TIP

1. Put bananas through the potato masher to pulp them quickly. Four or five bananas are required for 1 1/2 cups mashed.
2. To make fine oatmeal from coarse rolled oats put the cereal through food chopper, then measure.
3. Ever try coconut flavoring and nutmeg in a butter icing for a plain cake or a Banana Loaf?
4. To measure 1 cup sifted pastry flour, sift and fill one measuring cup, then remove 3 tablespoons flour.

BANANA BREAD

- 1 1/2 cups sifted flour
 - 2 1/2 tps. baking powder
 - 1/2 tsp. baking soda
 - 1/2 tsp. salt
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 egg, beaten
 - 1 1/2 cups mashed bananas
 - 1/2 cup melted lard
 - 1 cup shredded bran
 - 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- Sift the flour with baking powder, soda, salt and sugar. Combine egg, bananas, lard and bran. Add dry ingredients and nuts to banana mixture, mixing only enough to moisten dry ingredients. Pour into greased loaf pan (about 5" x 9") and bake in electric oven at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Makes 1 loaf.

Cinnamon Doughnuts

- 1 1/2 tps. shortening
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 egg, separated
 - 1/2 cup milk
 - 2 1/2 cups cake flour
 - 3 tps. baking powder
 - 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
 - 1/2 tsp. cloves
 - 1/2 tsp. salt
- Cream the shortening, sugar and egg yolk together. Add alternately the milk and half the flour, sifted with the other ingredients. Add the remaining flour slowly and beaten egg white last. Turn the dough out on a lightly floured board and pat to half inch thickness. Cut with doughnut cutter, or cut in strips and shape in figure 8. Fry in melted shortening heated to 375 degrees or until an inch cube of bread browns in 40 seconds. Turn doughnuts in two minutes; brown another minute. Drain. While warm sprinkle with sugar. Makes about 2 1/2 dozen.

Matrimonial Cakes

- 1/2 lb. chopped dates
 - 2-3rd cup water
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1-3rd cup chopped nuts
 - 2 1/2 cups fine oatmeal
 - 1 1/2 cups flour
 - 1 cup brown sugar
 - 1 tsp. baking soda
 - 1/2 tsp. salt
 - 3/4 cup soft butter
- Cook dates, water and sugar until like jam. Allow to cool and add walnuts. Mix the oatmeal, flour, brown sugar, soda, salt and work in the butter with finger tips. Put two-thirds of this mixture in a greased 9-inch cake pan. Spread date filling over it and then sprinkle on the remaining crumbs mix. Bake in preheated electric oven at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Cut in squares when cool.

FARM FORUM

Suggest Encouragements For Country Doctors

Ready assistance during wintry weather to help a doctor reach his destination, improved telephone service and a prepaid medical and sickness policy were suggestions made by Halton farm forums last week as inducements for country doctors.

A shortage of rural doctors and what can be done to overcome it was the broadcast topic. It was of particular interest to rural residents who feel that there are not enough doctors setting up practice in smaller towns.

The forums also felt that nursing service in Halton is inadequate and the consensus of opinion is that nurses should have a shorter training period and higher pay. A.V.O.N. nursing service was also suggested.

In regard to hospital services,

eight forums report hospitals are adequate while the remainder thought there should be more. Zimmerman suggested a county hospital with 25 beds.

Four forums thought there were enough dentists in their communities, others said more were needed.

Asked what factors would be likely to discourage a doctor from practicing in a small community, some said that 24 hour duty without relief and unavoidable wintry road conditions were large factors. The Halton Cooperative Medical Services was an offsetting factor which encouraged doctors in the county.
