## Cameron Moderator

Rev. Ross K. Cameron was elected moderator of the presbytery of West Toronto last Tuesday when Presbyterian ministers and elders met in Georgetown for their monthly meeting.

Mr. Cameron, who is minister of Dowercourt Presbyterian Church, Toronto, is a former Georgetown resident whose father was for many years minister of Knox Church here. He succeeded Rev. David Kerr of Royce Avenue Church, Toronto.

Main item of business at the meeting was the call extended to Rev. J. L. Self by the congregation of Knox Church, Midland. Mr. Self will leave Norval and Union at the end of the year. The unanimous call was extended by Rev. J. L. Burgess, interim moderator, of Elmville and a delegation from the Midland Church.

Delegates from Norval and Union were present and Mrs. Percy Leslie, Mrs. George Leslie, Malcolm McNabb and Vern Thompson spoke for those churches, paying tribute to Mr. Self's work there and wishing him every success in his new field. Other delegates from the churches included Craig McClure, Oliver Hunter, Wilfrid Leslie and Mrs. Clarence Anderson.

Mr. Kerr was chairman for the meeting and Rev. David McCullough of Oakwood acted as secretary in the absence of Rev. Edgar Foreman of Morningglade Church, Toronto, who is recuperating from a heart attack.

A turkey dinner was served to the gathering at the noon hour by the ladies of Knox Church. It was the first time presbytery had met here in over twenty years.

### Anderson Team Still Leading Major Bowlers

 Bill Anderson's team is still well in the lead in the major bowling league. This week they won two games from Kirby, the losers taking one game and the total pinfall. Bailey's team relieved Duke Wilson of two games and the pinfall for a score of 5 to 2.

Anderson now has 53 points and a total pinfall of 34,146. They have won 23 games and lost 10. Kirby is second with 40 points and pinfall 33,480. They have won 17 and lost 16. Bailey is sole possessor of third place with a pinfall of 32,663. They have won 17 and lost 16, the extra point for total pinfall each night making the difference between second and third place teams. Wilson's team in fourth spot is desperately trying but can't seem to make the gain on points. They have 27 with a pinfall of 31,547, have lost 21 games and won 12.

High single of the week was rolled by Nip Shipway, 315. Duke Wilson was in second spot, 304 and Bill Anderson third, 302.

Ace Bailey took high triple with 738 (235, 228, 275). Duke Wilson was second with 729 and Nip Shipway third, 720. Bill Anderson had a good score 708.

Single team score of the night was rolled by Wilson's team with 1121. Wilson 304, Herbert 259, Cook 225, Carney 222 and Chappel 111, which was low game for the week.

Anderson's team was second with 1119. Team score of the night went to Kirby with 3223, Anderson taking second with 3206.

Some of the year's best triple scores have been rolled by Anderson 842, Wilson 781, Hall 761 and Brandford 748. Joe Hall's 376 is still tops for high single and Dave Stamp has a good high of 332.

### TEN COMMANDMENTS HUNTERS' "MUSTS"

The ten commandments of hunting sound so reasonable that many district hunters perhaps consider them not worth repeating. For safety first, though, these rules should never be forgotten by anyone carrying a gun.

1. Every gun is loaded until you yourself, have unloaded it.
2. Never carry a loaded gun. Remove the bolt or take down the mechanism.
3. Be sure that nothing is stuck in the barrel — mud, dirt or a clot of grease.
4. Carry the gun so the muzzle is always under control, even if you fall.
5. Make sure you can distinguish your target before you fire. Know what it is. See it.
6. Never point a gun in fun, never except at something you want to shoot.
7. Never leave any loaded gun unattended.
8. Never climb a fence or tree with a loaded gun.
9. Never shoot at hard flat surfaces or at water.
10. Never mix horsplay and gun.
