Under the present set-up 400 cigarettes may be sent for \$2.00. However all orders are limited to \$2.00 at the present time. This applies only to Canadian troops serving abroad and does NOT include Special Force personnel who are training in the U.S.A. This is a step in the right direction, and will certainly be appreciated by the boys in the 'Pats' in Korea. As far as we can ascertain, there is only one local man with them, Earl Bearman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Bearman of Georgetown.

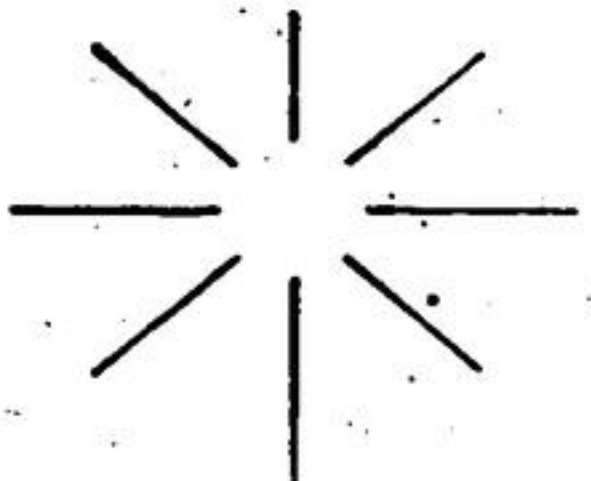

Eight Arrested After Walkerton Rink Fight

A woman was trampled unconscious and five spectators and three players were arrested after a fight during a hockey game in Walkerton recently. Walkerton Merchants were playing Bridgeport Vets, a rough and ready Intermediate outfit who played a couple of exhibition games with Georgetown earlier this season.

Charged with disorderly conduct were George A. Burgess, president of the Bridgeport hockey club, Robert Rafferty, playing coach and defenceman Wally Kullman of the Vets, three Bridgeport spectators; David Silk, sub-goalie of the Merchants; and Sullivan, a player on the town's W.O.A. entry.

A Bridgeport lady was trampled and removed from the rink unconscious. After treatment at Walkerton Hospital she was able to return home on the players' bus.

The fight started near the close of the third-period of a rugged contest, won by Walkerton 8-2. Three defencemen, Sell and Schnurr of Walkerton and Schaefer of Bridgeport were involved in a fight, all drawing major penalties.
