**TWO ASSESSMENTS REDUCED SEVEN APPEALS DENIED AS REVISION COURT MEETS**

Of nine appeals which came before a Court of Revision in Georgetown last week, seven assessments were confirmed and two were slightly reduced because of technical errors in appraising the properties.

The assessment of Mrs. John W. Kennedy, Church Street, was reduced \$125 and that of Harry Mann, College Street, \$175.

Unsuccessful appellants were Ray Harley, Edgar Scott, Mrs. A. Cowie, Charles Renwick, Hubert Derricks, Ernest Simson and Harry Bailey.

The appeals were the first heard in Georgetown by the newly-established county Court of Revision. Lt.-Col. Gordon Brown of Esquimaux was chairman and members are Alex Near, Nassagaweya, T. Jones, Acton, J. L. Blair, Burlington and William Anderson, Oakville.

**News and Views For Halton Farmers**

**MILTON NIGHT SCHOOL RE-OPENS JANUARY 9th**

During the past week, the local committee under the chairmanship of A. T. Woodley, met to complete plans for the reopening of the Night School in Milton on January 9th. Notwithstanding the fact that there is already an enrolment of over three hundred in the courses being offered, many other applications have been received since the course opened on November 28th. It was the decision of the committee that in fairness to those already enrolled, no further applications be considered except in the courses in Farm Business, Farm Machinery, and Choral Singing. Their decision was based on the lack of further accommodation in some of the classrooms, and in other courses such as Clothing, Tailoring, Leathercraft, Oil Painting and Public Speaking, due to the impossibility of the instructors giving the necessary individual attention to additional students. We can only suggest to those disappointed this year because their applications were not accepted, that if the Night School is re-organized in the fall of 1951, they get their applications in on time.

**HALTON JERSEY BREEDERS MAKE GOOD RECORDS**

The monthly issues of the Canadian Jersey Breeder reveal that Halton Jersey Breeders continue to hit around the top when it comes to producing good R.O.P. records. Just recently we noted that two cows in the herd of Ken Ella, of Hornby, had turned out two nice records. Both as three year olds in 305 days had each produced well over 500 lbs. of fat. Sporting Standard Star with 9978 lbs. milk and 521 lbs. B.F. and Sunnycrest Prudent Roseland with 10,338 lbs. milk and 553 lbs. Butterfat.

In the November issue we noted Gerald R. Graham, of Ashgrove, with a two year old class leader in 365 days, namely Graham Farm Pinn B. Dinah, with 11,906 lbs. milk and 548 lbs. fat. In the December issue, we find Maurice C. Beaty of Trafalgar Township, with two class leaders, first, Lindale Lady Basilia, as a 4 year old in 365 days produced 11,187 lbs. milk and 664 lbs. fat, and Lindale Basil Roseba, as a 4 year old, in 365 days made a nice record of 9,905 lbs. milk and 570 lbs. fat. It will be recalled that Roseba was the first prize dry cow at the 1950 Halton and Ontario shows, and was fourth in that class of cows at the Royal, being beaten only by three American cows.

Passing on down to Jack and Bill Featherstone, near Trafalgar, we find them turning out some great records on their three daughters of old Zana, or to be more correct, "Fairy Raleigh Zana", the former long distance champion. First, there is Avonlea King's Raleigh Zana, with 12,708 lbs. of milk and 724 lbs. fat as a four-year old in 365. She is again on test as a five year old and in the first eight months has out over 600 lbs. of fat, so she definitely is pointing to another Gold Medal perhaps medal of merit record. Her sister, Avonlea Records Suzanna it will be recalled was the grand champion at the Halton Shows in 1947, 48, and 49, and Grand champion at the Ontario Championship Show in 1950.

That Suzanna is something more than a show cow is substantiated both in production and breeding ability. She won a silver record as a two year old; a silver and gold medal as a three year old, and silver and gold medals again as a four year old. Her production in her last lactation was 11,875 lbs. milk in 305 days and her best butter fat production to date was 712 lbs. as a three year old. Suzanna's last heifer calf was first prize junior heifer-calf and reserve junior champion at the 1950 Royal for Don Head Farms, who she was sold during the summer for a four figure price by Featherstone Bros. One of Suzanna's sons is being used in the Artificial Unit at Maple.

The third sister, Avonlea Basil's Zana, has a two year record of 10,428 lbs. milk and 643 lbs. butterfat in 365 days, and in 1949 was first prize two year old in milk both at the Halton and Ontario Championship Shows.

Other nice records noted and which should be mentioned are from the herds of Mac Alexander of Norval; Geo. Hower of Moffat; Wm. Davies & Son, Palermo; McClure Bros, Georgetown; F. D. Charles, Georgetown; and Hans Kroiss, of Oakville.

In brief, the moral of this story might well be "Don't overlook your own county breeders when looking for good foundation stock."
