### FARM NEWS

#### Alfalfa Short Supply Predict Higher Price

Canadian grown alfalfa seed is in short supply and likely to be higher in price than last year, states A. H. Martin, Director, Crops Seeds & Weeds Branch, Toronto. Mr. Martin also stated that for the first time in a number of years Red Stained Alfalfa seed is likely to be available in Ontario. This seed is mostly of French origin with perhaps some from the Southern states. Authorities at Ottawa and Guelph state that the hardness of the seed is in doubt. As a matter of fact, that is the reason why the seed will be stained red — as a danger signal. It is stated that the differential between the price of domestic alfalfa and the red stained seed may be as much as 20 cents per pound. Halton farmers would

In our opinion it would be preferable for Halton farmers to cut their usual rate of seeding by one or two pounds per acre rather than take a chance on red stained seed of doubtful hardness.
