SOLDIER TRANSFERRED TO CHURCHILL, MAN.

A Georgetown boy, Spr. Leonard Tennant has been transferred with the Canadian army from Chilliwack, B.C. to Fort Churchill, Manitoba.

Writing to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Sam Tennant, he remarks on the change in climate from the warm, sunny British Columbia days

at Churchill where it never gets higher than 45 below zero. Len spent New Year's Eve in Edmonton where he went to a dance and attended another dance in Hudson Bay Junction New Year's Day.

The Churchill camp is something unique, he says. The various buildings are joined together by tunnels and soldiers go from their quarters to meals, canteen or show without going outside. Trips to Churchill town are allowed, but the Eskimo territory, just half a mile from camp is out of bounds.

Spr. Tennant says that it is strange to see dog teams in place of cars.

There is only one mail into camp once a week. He expects to leave soon for Seal River a hundred miles farther north.
