AT ESQUESING COUNCIL ON MONDAY, FEBRUARY 5th

A deputation of ratepayers from School Section No. 3 (Ashgrove) presented a petition signed by all but four ratepayers, asking that a by-law be passed to let the section out of the township school area.

The county health unit asked that at a garbage and refuse dump in Norval, "No Dumping" signs be erected at once and the dump be covered with earth.

A letter from the Department of Planning and Development, concerning a subdivision in Glen Williams, said that conditions for the Minister's approval of such a subdivision have not been completely satisfied.

The Grand Valley Conservation Authority sent a map showing the watershed boundary through Esquesing and pointed out that the land had been measured by an engineer who found the total amount of land within the boundaries of the watershed is 2.5 per cent of the total area of the township.

Council sent a resolution to the Ontario Agricultural Council at the Parliament Buildings, asking that township councils be given the right to pass by-laws regulating the loads of trucks in any season of the year where excessive damage is being done on the roads.

A by-law will be prepared appointing William Hulls as township building inspector.

Road superintendent William Townsend was appointed a delegate to the Good Roads convention.

Tenders will be advertised for the supplying of 10,000 yards of gravel, crushed and delivered on township roads this year, tenders to be in the hands of the road superintendent by Monday noon, March 5th.

A by-law was passed appointing a Board of Management for Norval Athletic Club.

A letter was received from the town of Acton concerning a bill from the township for grading and snow plowing on the 3rd line.

A sheep claim for \$30 for a ewe killed and \$10 for 2 lambs lost was paid to Donald Lindsay with \$8 to F. W. Shortill for 2 trips as valuator.

Claims for 43 foxes destroyed at \$5 each were paid to: C. S. Bailey, R. R. 2, Georgetown 11, C. J. Alexander, Milton, 7, John Buck, Milton, 5, C. W. Swackhamer, Acton, 4, Graydon Stover, Milton, 4, Harold DeForest, Terra Cotta, Frank Jones, John Chisholm, James Steele, Acton, 2 each, Lawrence Rayner, Syd Morris, Charlie Thompson, Edward McLean, Georgetown, one each.

A donation of \$25 was made to Halton Music Festival Accounts included Bonds \$4431, Relief \$95, Assessment supplies \$110; Maintenance of patients at Ontario Hospital, Woodstock, \$90.

A resolution was passed and forwarded to the Agricultural Council in Toronto, which read as follows: Whereas the weed situation on many township roads of this province is deplorable and whereas many township councils in planning their budget for the year include a definite sum of money to be used to defray the cost of spraying at least a portion of their roads each year, only to find when the subsidy on road expenditure is approved by the Dept. of Highways that when essential road and bridge maintenance is taken care of, no money is available for weed control work, therefore be it resolved that we request the Honorable Minister of Agriculture to use his influence to see that this situation is rectified.
