**FARM FORUMS**

**FORUMS PRAISE WORK OF AGR. FEDERATION**

Accomplishments of the International Federation of Agriculture were discussed at the county farm forums on February 19th after listening to the broadcast.

Halton farm groups said that IFAP has been the means of distributing world surpluses. It helps to promote better world trade agreements, encourages stronger independent farm organizations and promotes good will and understanding between farmers of many countries. Kilbride summed it up by saying "It is the farmer's mouthpiece and because it is a young organization, the best is yet to come."

Forums are connected with the Canadian Federation of Agriculture through provincial, county and township federations, as well as through such organizations as Milk, Cream and Hog Producers and Fruit and Vegetable Growers.

Each forum has a representative appointed to attend all federation meetings. His duty is to participate in activities and policy making and report to his forum. Finding sheets filled out by individual farm forums are compiled at the head office and represent farm opinion on federation questions.
