'The Perfect Woman'

British Army Veteran Retired Civil Servant

Ill in Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto for several weeks, Henry Ross Gunning died there on Sunday, February 18th. He was 71 years of age.

Mr. Gunning, who was the son of the late John Charles Gunning, was born in the Andaman Islands in the Indian Ocean between Singapore and Ceylon, where his father was military governor. He was sent to England as a lad of four to take his schooling.

He joined the British Army and served in India, then in the South African War where he was wounded in action. After the war he was with the army in Malta and Egypt.

He left the army in 1910 and came to Canada, settling in Winnipeg where he married Violet G. Cubitt. He served overseas with the Canadian forces in the first World War and after returning home moved to Vancouver. In 1930 he went to Ottawa to work with the Dept. of Veterans Affairs.

Retiring from the civil service in 1945, he moved to Victoria, B.C. and since last summer had made his home in Hamilton.

He is survived by his wife, and four children, Marion of Montreal, Evelyn of Victoria, B.C., John of Georgetown and Richard of Powell River, B.C.

Archdeacon W. G. O. Thompson conducted the funeral service at the McChure Funeral Home on Wednesday. Members of Branch 120, Canadian Legion, led by the president, David Bowman conducted a Legion service at the graveside in Greenwood Cemetery. Pallbearers were Jack Kerr, Fred McCartney, Marshall Timbers, Walter Louth, Ed Francis and Pere Chaplin.
