Bell Tel Report Shows 1600 Telephones Here

A total of 1,728,000 telephones were in use by Bell Telephone customers in 1950 according to the annual report issued by the company. This was an increase of 131,000 in a one-year period.

In Georgetown 1600 are now in service, an increase of 82 during the year. Average daily local calls in Georgetown, as in other centres increased about 10 per cent. Long distance was also used more.

The company is in sound financial condition. While operating expenses were 15 per cent higher, total revenue was 19 per cent more. A temporary rate increase, the first in many years, was granted in July by the Board of Transport Commissioners, designed to increase revenue 16 per cent and halt depletion of the surplus. The increase was confirmed later effective January 1 this year.

The Bell-Company spent \$69 million on new construction and number of employees increased to 30,000. Payroll was up 12 per cent to \$69 million.

An interesting fact is that the total plant investment now is \$522 million which is an average of \$302 per telephone.

Junior Farmers Section Highlight of Grain Show

The Halton Junior Farmers Section was again the outstanding feature of the sixteenth annual Halton Seed Fair held at Milton on Saturday. The Juniors are to be commended particularly on their educational displays. All five Junior Farmer Clubs were in competition and it was with difficulty that the judges made their decision between the entries of the Milton and Palermo Clubs, both of which were outstanding.

In the open section of the show, competition was particularly keen in the oat classes, with no less than 19 lots in competition in the bushel classes and twelve entries in the ten bushel class.

The T. Eaton Co. Special for the Champion exhibit in the open show, was won by Earl Wilson of Norval, on his entry of red clover. Calvin Aitken of Acton won the special for the largest number of entries which was donated by the Burlington Branch of the Bank of Toronto.

To return to the Junior Farmer section, the Royal Bank Special donated by their Burlington Branch, to be awarded to the Junior Farmer winning the most points, was won by Floyd Bridgen, of the Norval Club. The Halton Junior Farmer Special awarded to the Club with the largest number of entries

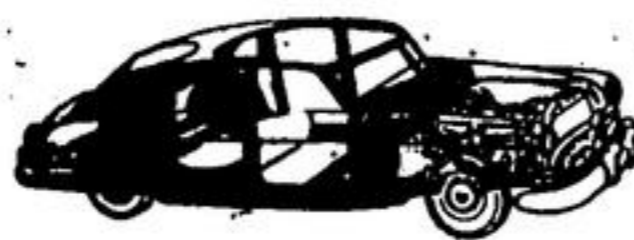
