FARM FORUMS

SUGGESTS IMPROVEMENTS FARM EXTENSION SERVICE

A disposal plant for garbage, better weed spraying and weed control, and more emphasis on extension rather than experimentation were improvements suggested by Halton farm forums at their meetings last week. Farm and home extension services was the topic for the broadcast and discussion.

Forums agreed that farmers do not make the most of the agricultural services available to them, but there is a growing tendency to do so. Specialized farmers have been the first to realize the benefits they can derive. Young farmers, they said, should be encouraged to join club clubs. More use should be made of films, for they give a better grasp of the subject than the spoken word. Well deserved praise was given agricultural representative J. E. Whitelock and some thought that even the cartoon on the finding sheet did not represent all his responsibilities.
