Mobile X-Ray Clinic Visits High School

Through the co operation of the Ontario Department of Health the Halton County Health and Tuberculosis Association and the Halton County Health Unit, free chest x-rays are being offered to all high school students in Halton county This has been made possible by the purchase of Christmas seals by the people of 'Halton County.

A mobile clinic from the Provincial Department of Health will visit the high schools in Acton, Burlington, Georgetown and Milton. In Qakville, the students will have their x-rays done in the Oakville-Trafalgar Memorial Hospital where, thro a federal health grant; special X-ray equipment was installed when the hospital was built. With the problem of some of the bowlers from the minor league ready to move into the majors, a meeting of team captains of that league will be held to determine what will be the best thing to do.


